TELETYPEWRITER



9-AUDIBLE AND VISUAL TELEPHONE SIGNALS



Some locations are so noisy the ordinary telephone bell cannot be heard. In such cases a gong. loud bell or horn is needed. Where there are several telephones at one location, they can be fitted



with bells of different tones. Lamp signals flash a warning when a call comes in . . . and, if there is more than one telephone, tell which line it is on.
