THE CHARGE FOR A LOCAL CALL

IF YOU REACH A WRONG NUMBER

Ask whoever answers what city he is in. Then dial Operator and tell her so you will not be billed for the call.

PARTY LINE CALLS

If you always hear a busy signal when calling a certain local number it may be that the number is on your party line. To find out if it is and how to complete your call dial 611 (Repair Service).

BUSINESS with the COMPANY

HELPFUL INFORMATION



Automatic ANSWERING SET

Certain telephones are equipped with an automatic device, known as an Automatic Answering Set, which answers the telephone mechanically when no person is available to answer and then makes a recorded announcement.

If your call is answered by an Automatic Answering Set, listen carefully for the announcement which will be self-explanatory.

Some of these sets will also receive and record a message from the caller.

When You Hear A "BEEP" TONE

If you hear a short high "beep" tone every 15 seconds or so, it means that the person with whom you are talking is recording your conversation. This signal is produced by recorder-connector equipment furnished by the Telephone Company. Use of a recorder on the telephone line without this equipment is prohibited by the Company's tariffs.



For faster service this attractive Blue Book of Telephone Numbers provides a handy place for keeping your personal list of local and out-of-town numbers.




Tariffs which show rates, rules and regulations for telephone service and facilities, which are on file with the California Public Utilities Commission, are available in our Business Offices for public inspection.
