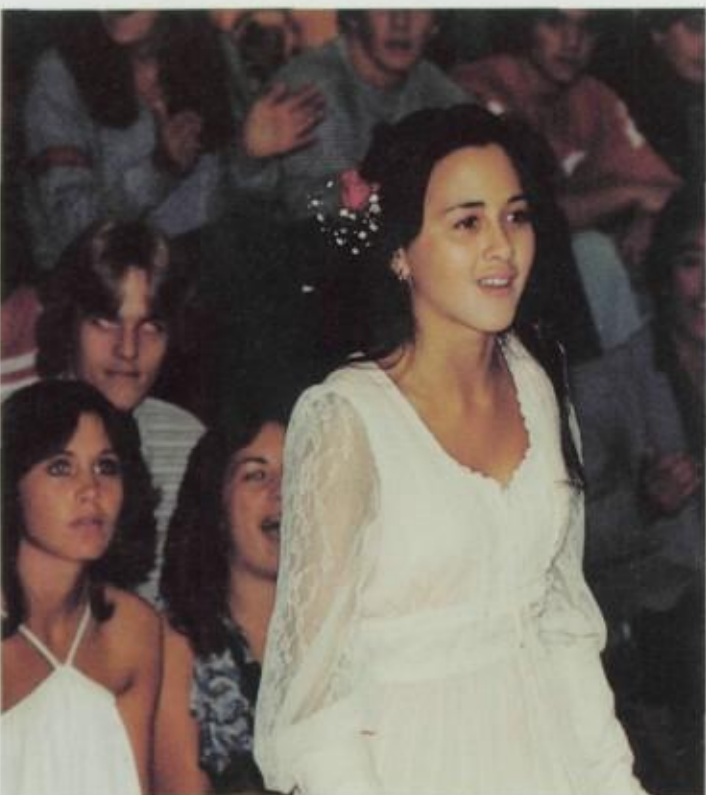

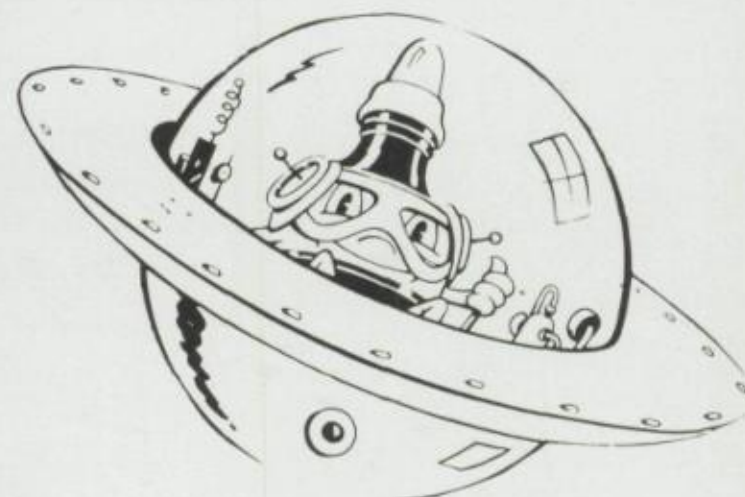
TIME CAPSULE

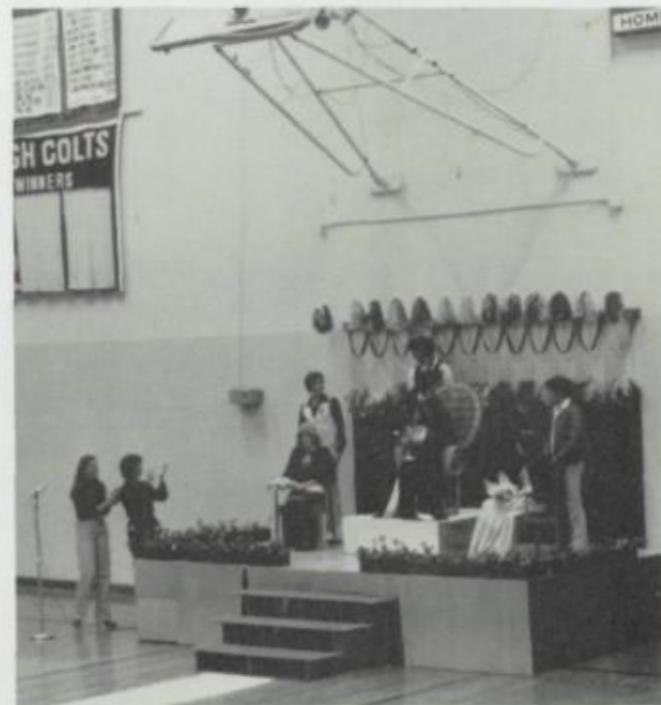


Committee

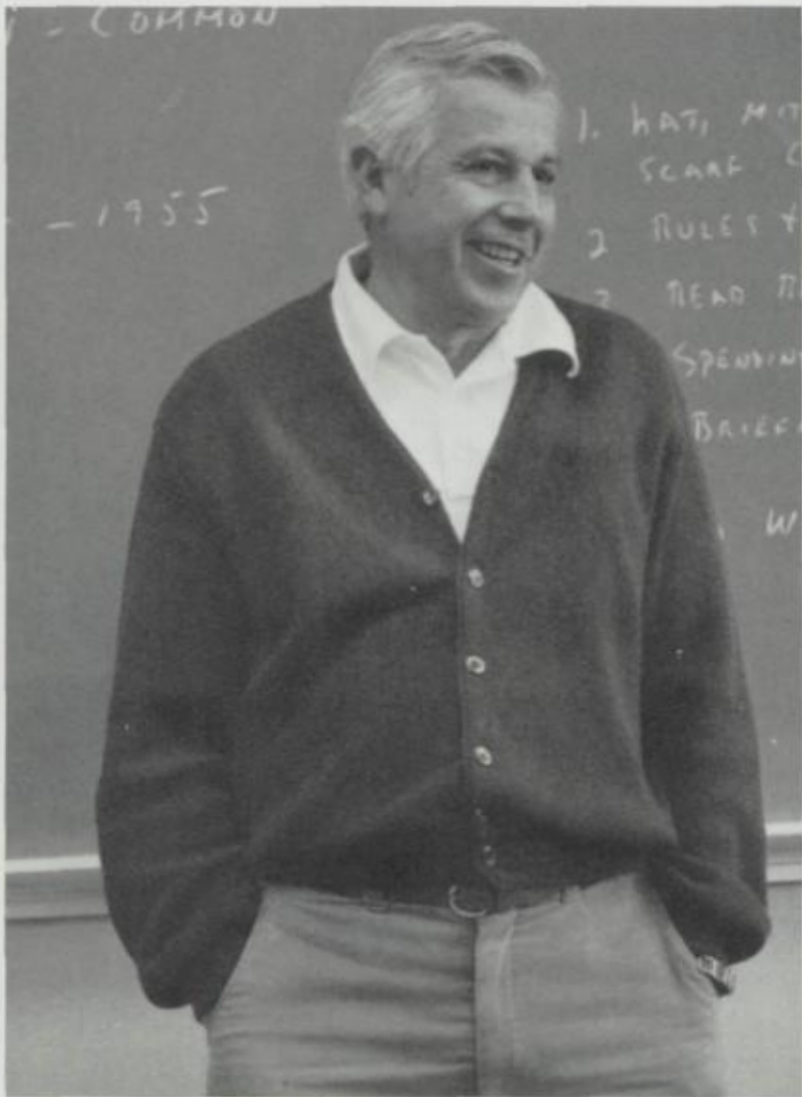

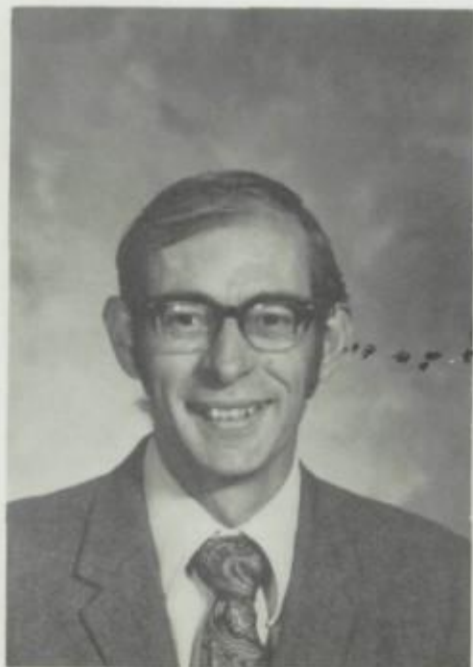
PERFORMING ARTS
