Now, more than ever before, American youth is conscious of the tremendous responsibility that has been placed on its shoulders. The National Defense program calls for complete coöperation from both adults and youth. At Galileo, the R.O.T.C. has accomplished measurable results. The R.O.T.C. is composed of male students who learn reading, first aid, characteristics of rifles, how to operate different guns, and many other military maneuvers. The policy and history of the government is also included in the course of training.





























































football review



The main event of the term was the semi-annual "Play Day" for girls, held in the gym on December 12.






















