




### Dedication

Since most of the 1963 staff will be gone with graduation, we hope that this Telescope will serve as a remembrance of us and as a token of our gratitude.







#### The City's First . . . At Galileo







The Galileo Student Court consists of a chief justice, two associate judges, a public defender, a prosecutor, and a recorder.


The purpose of the Student Court is





After graduation we went our separate ways; only the memories linger in our minds to remind us of high school friends.










Each member of the staff contributed his share toward making the book. I would like to take this opportunity to thank each one of them for their fine work. They made my job much easier.








