

If one considers a lifetime to be the traditional 70 years, simple arithmetic will demonstrate that the United States of America is a nation not yet three lifetimes old. This country has had only two complete changes in population. If this information impresses you with the youth of the nation, be further impressed that George Washington High School, a relatively young school, has endured seven complete changes in population since its founding almost 22 years ago.

Because each student remains in high school only three years, a school is a constantly changing institution. Therefore, a tradition put aside for two years dies a sudden death. For example, at the time of this writing as plans are being made for the May Festival, only the senior classes have had the experience of planning and participating in a previous festival. The situation has occurred as the result of the cancellation of only one festival.

Think then of what can happen to our high academic standards if we allow ourselves to become lax about them for even a short time. No student who enters this school because he knows it is a great school can afford to count on the force of the past or the force of tradition or the force of habit to keep this school great.

Each must do more than inherit a tradition. He must, each day, re-create it.

Executive Council and Co-Board

The Executive Council is the backbone of George Washington's Student Government. Being the legislative body, it has the power to make all laws.

The Council, presided over by the Student Body president, is composed of all the student body and class officers, presidents of the G.S.S., Eagles and Scarlet and Gray Societies, and advised by the student body sponsor, Miss Archer.

Meetings are held several times throughout the term






The society is composed of outstanding members of the Low and High Senior classes. They are chosen on the basis of scholarship and citizenship at the end of their High Junior term.






Then we had our first open-campus double lunch of the year. During the lunch stunts in the stadium and the Lettermen Dunk-O booth were featured.


In the afternoon the faculty took over and presented to the student body their hilarious rally.







The Eagles were dealt their second setback by a powerful Balboa football team. The Eagles were blanked for the first time in the season. Score: Balboa 26, Washington 0.





The JV's next game was with Galileo at Washington. This was our best game of the season. Keith Someya scored three times to help trounce the weak Lions, 38-6.



FEB. 27 - SACRED HEART 45, WASHINGTON 44





112's




120's





They will also participate in a Music Festival at Berkeley.






