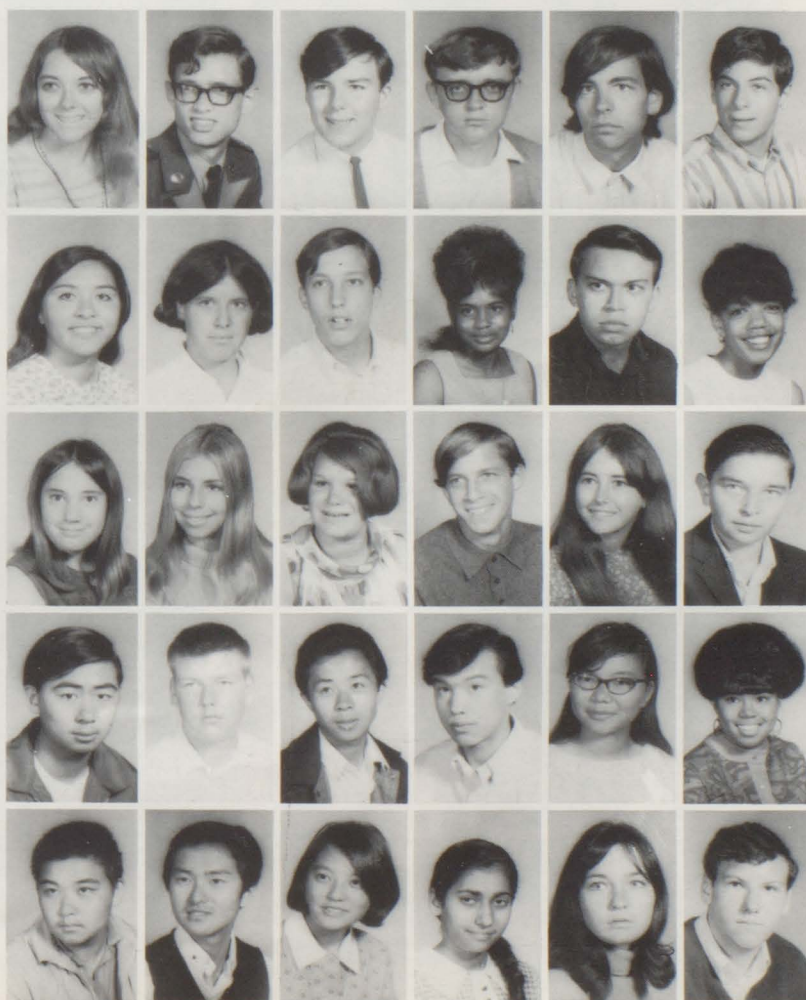

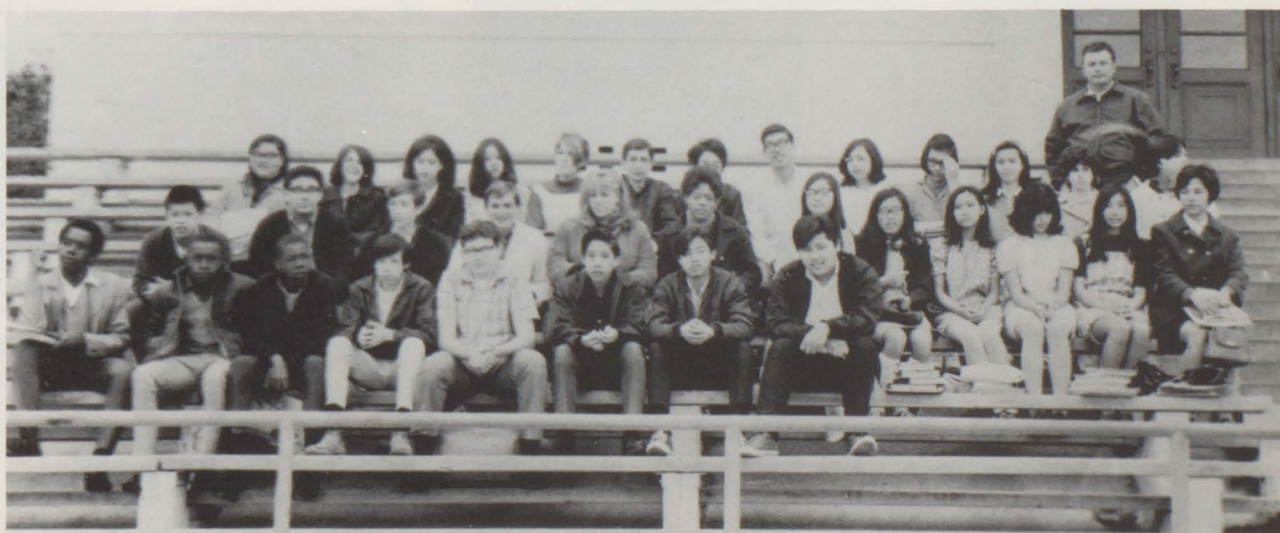

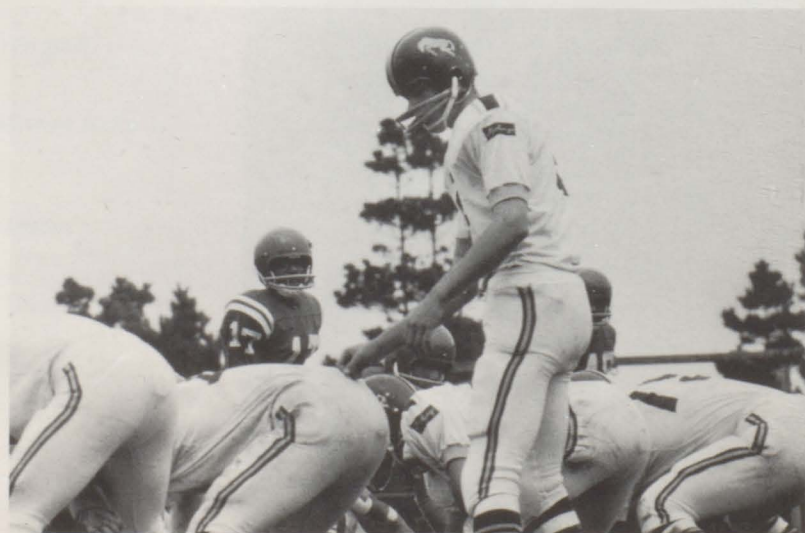

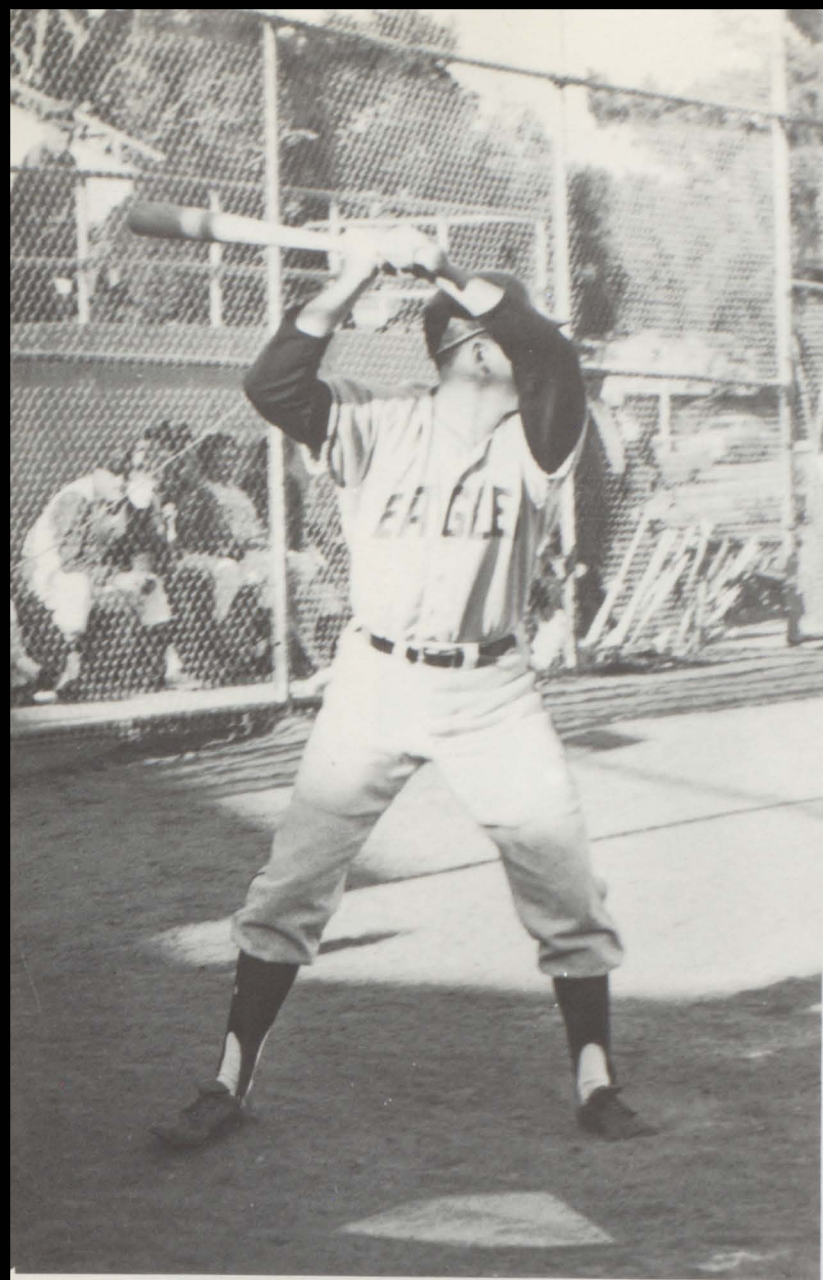

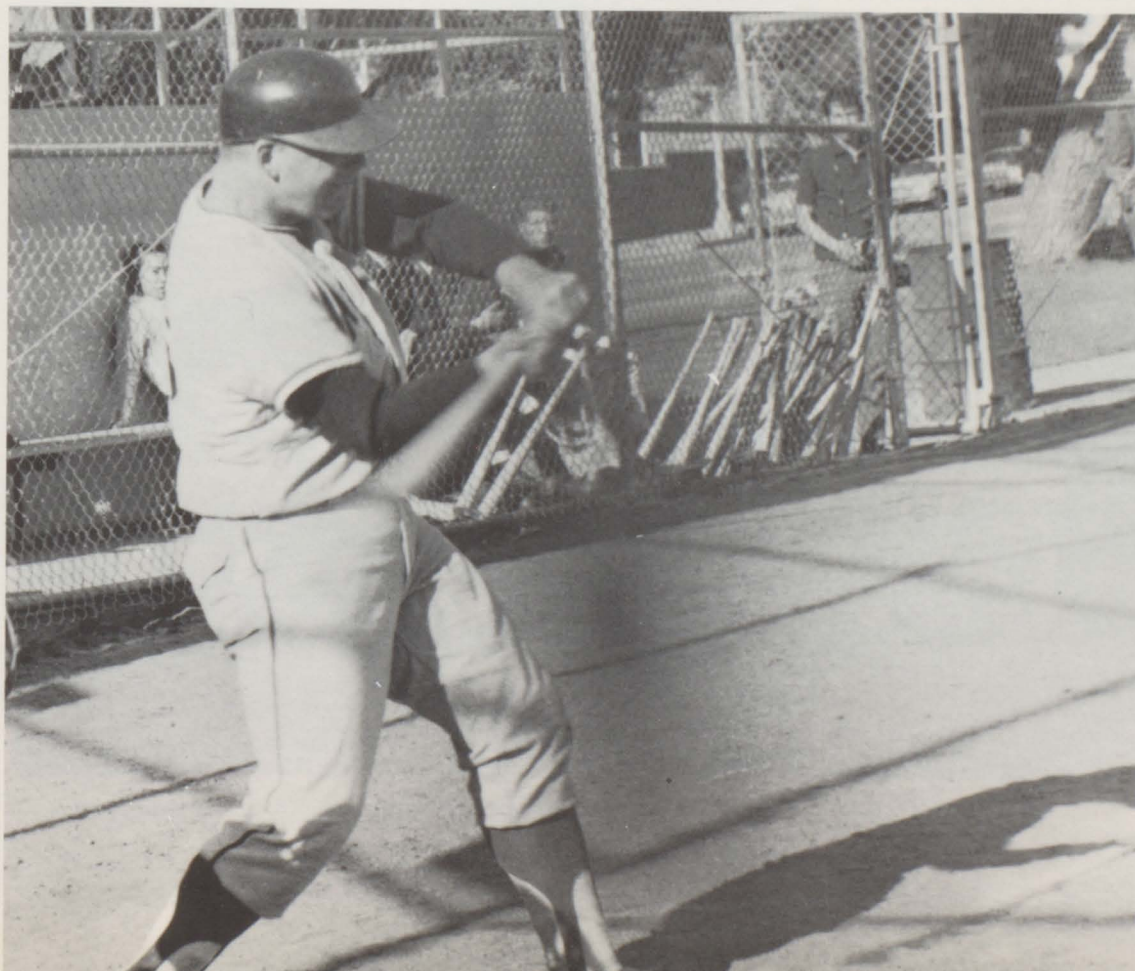

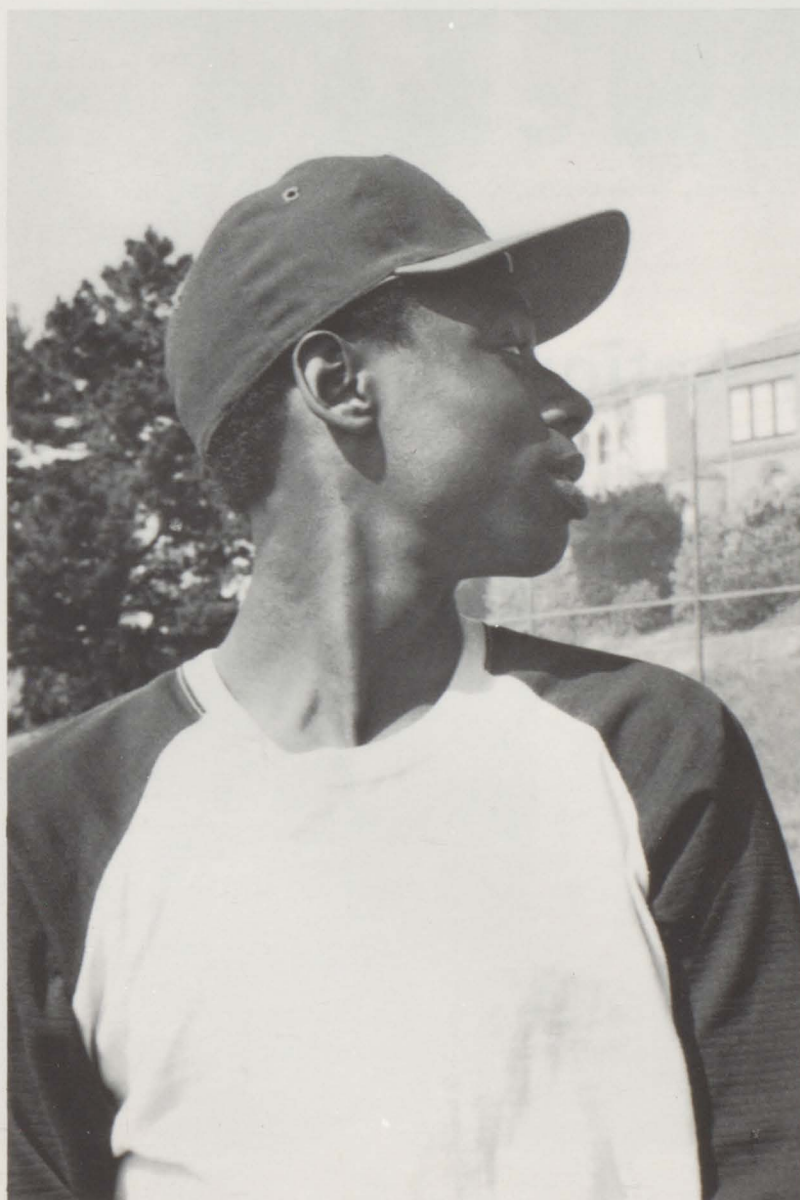

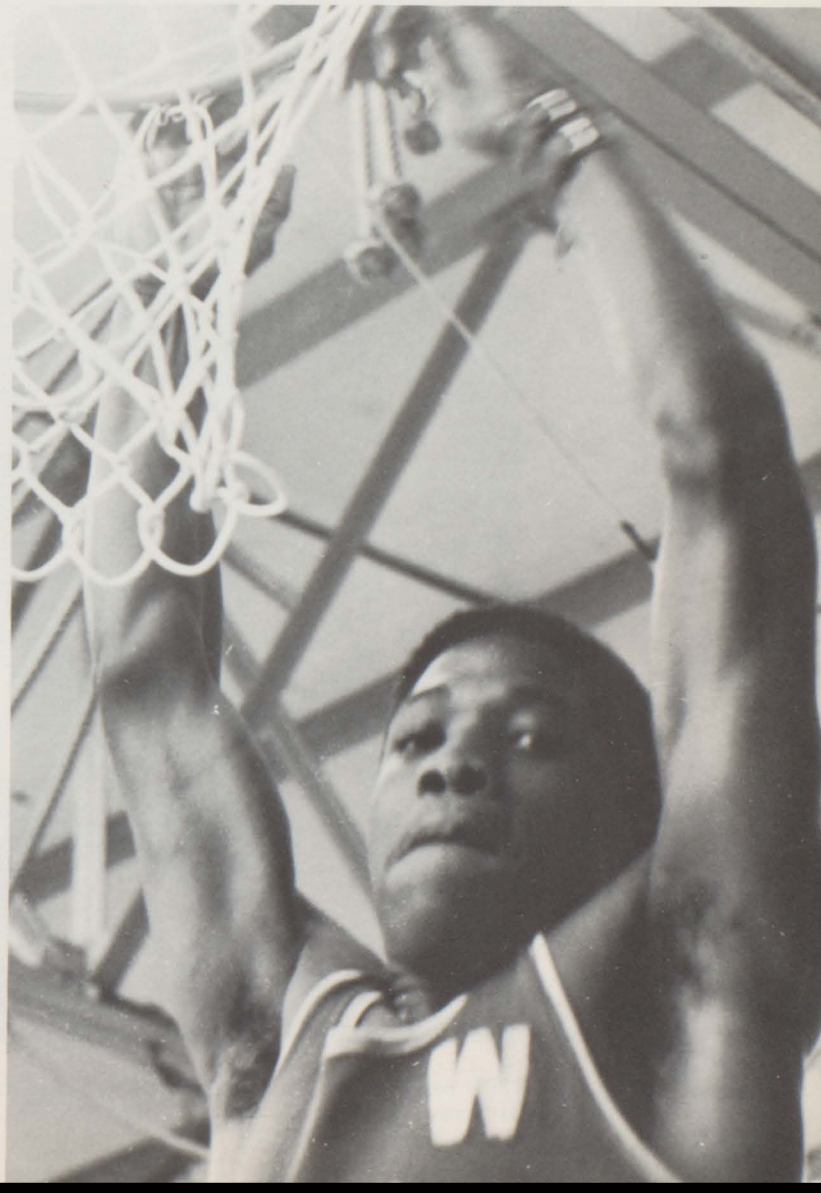

In seven games played this season, the Eagles have scored 23 goals, and allowed only 5 by the opposing team.

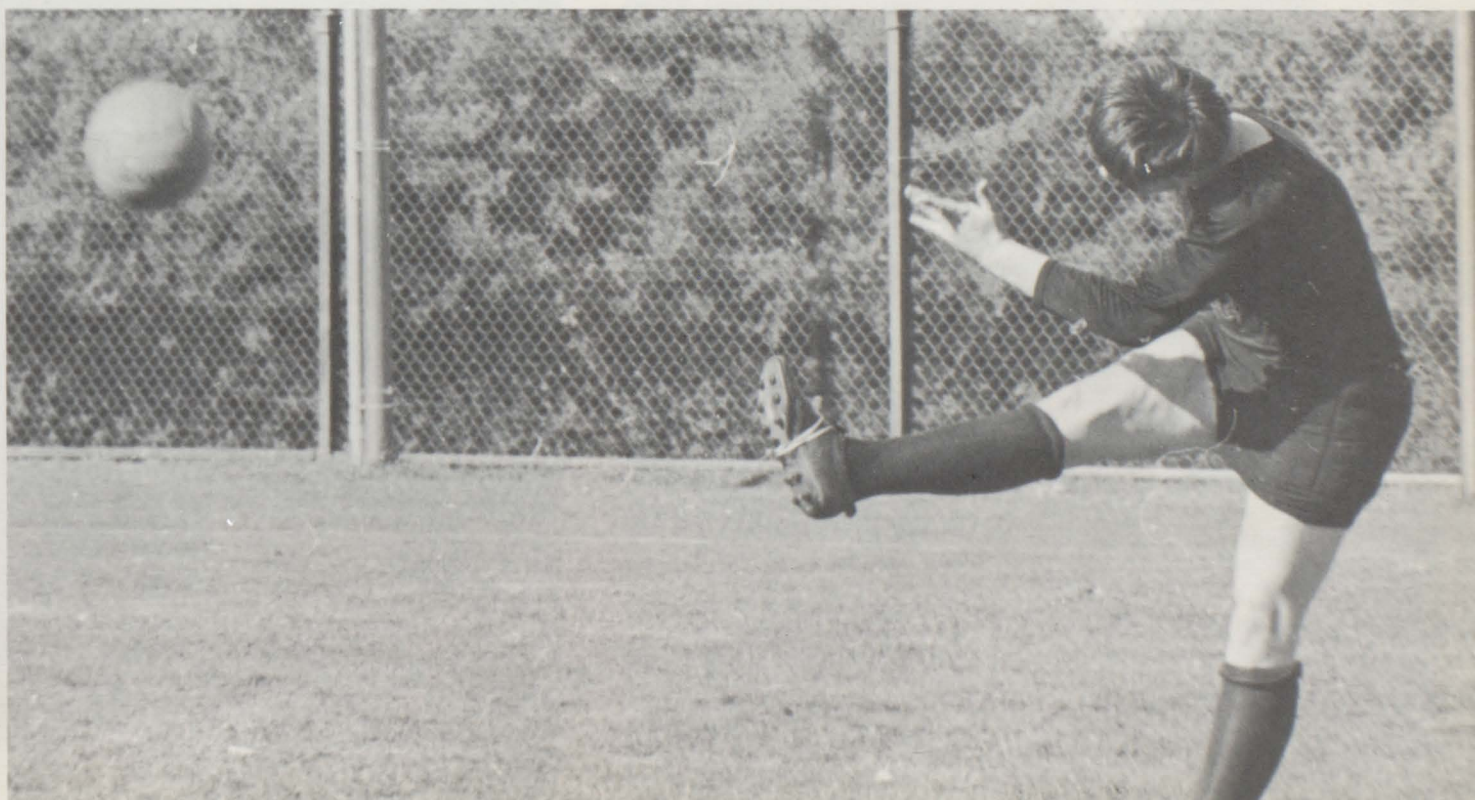

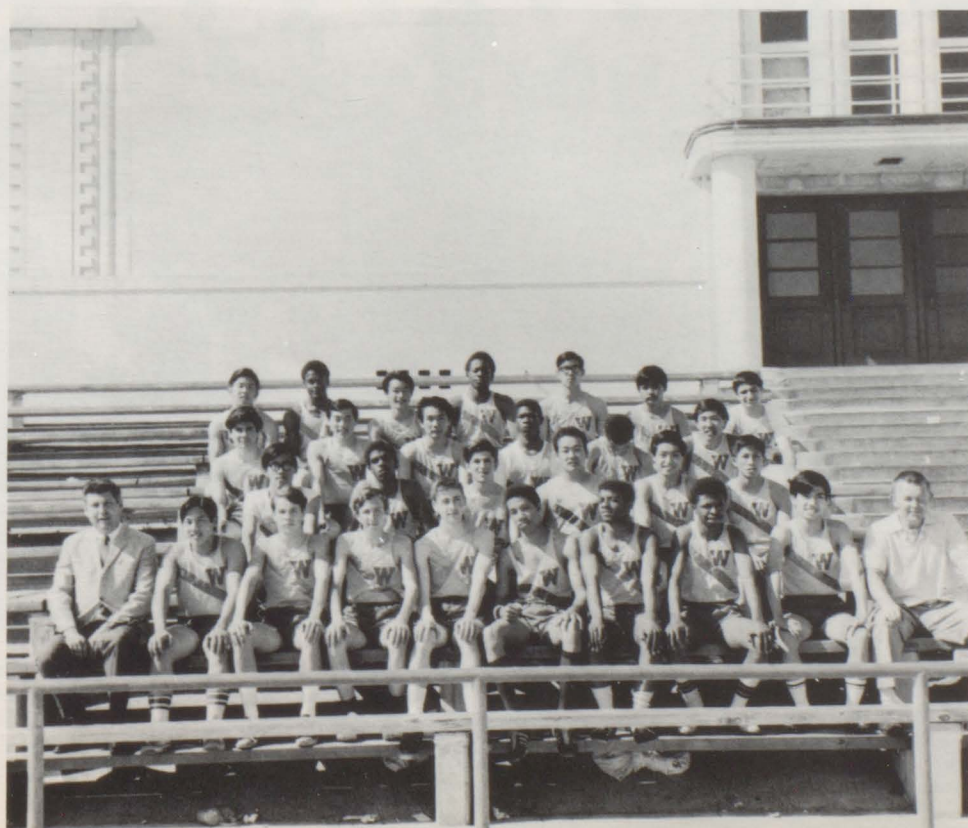

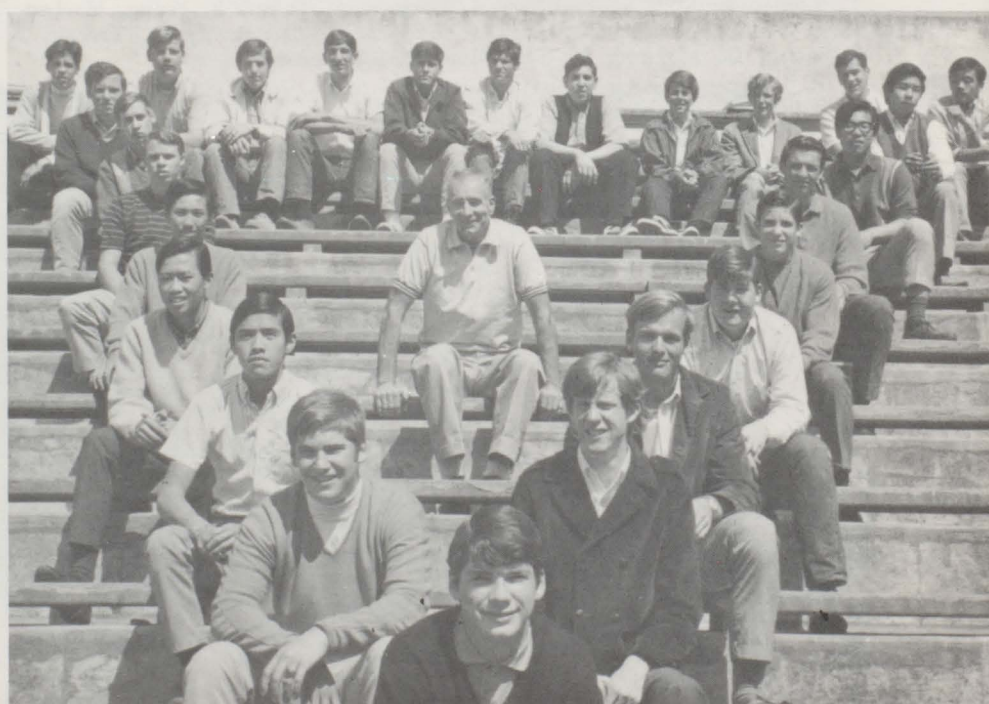

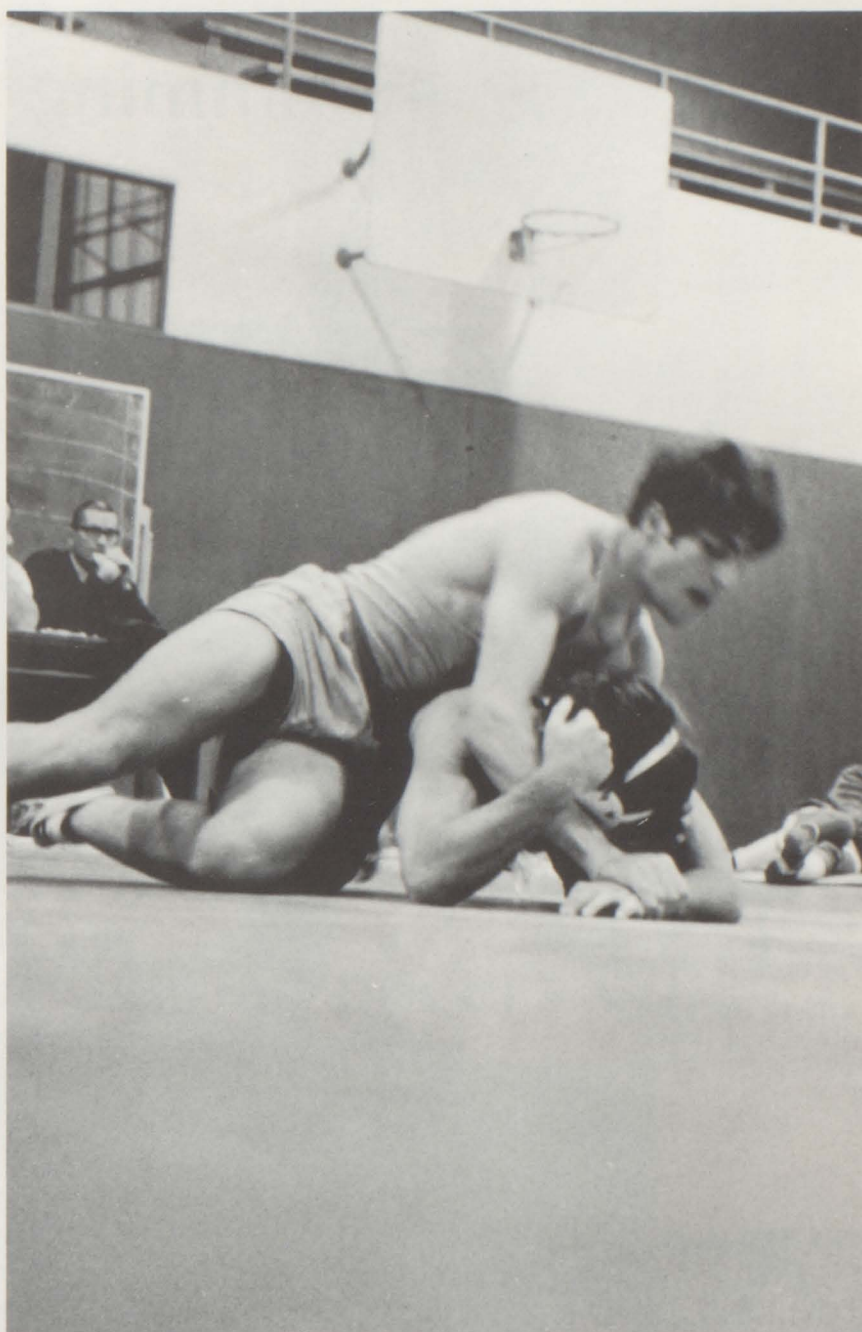

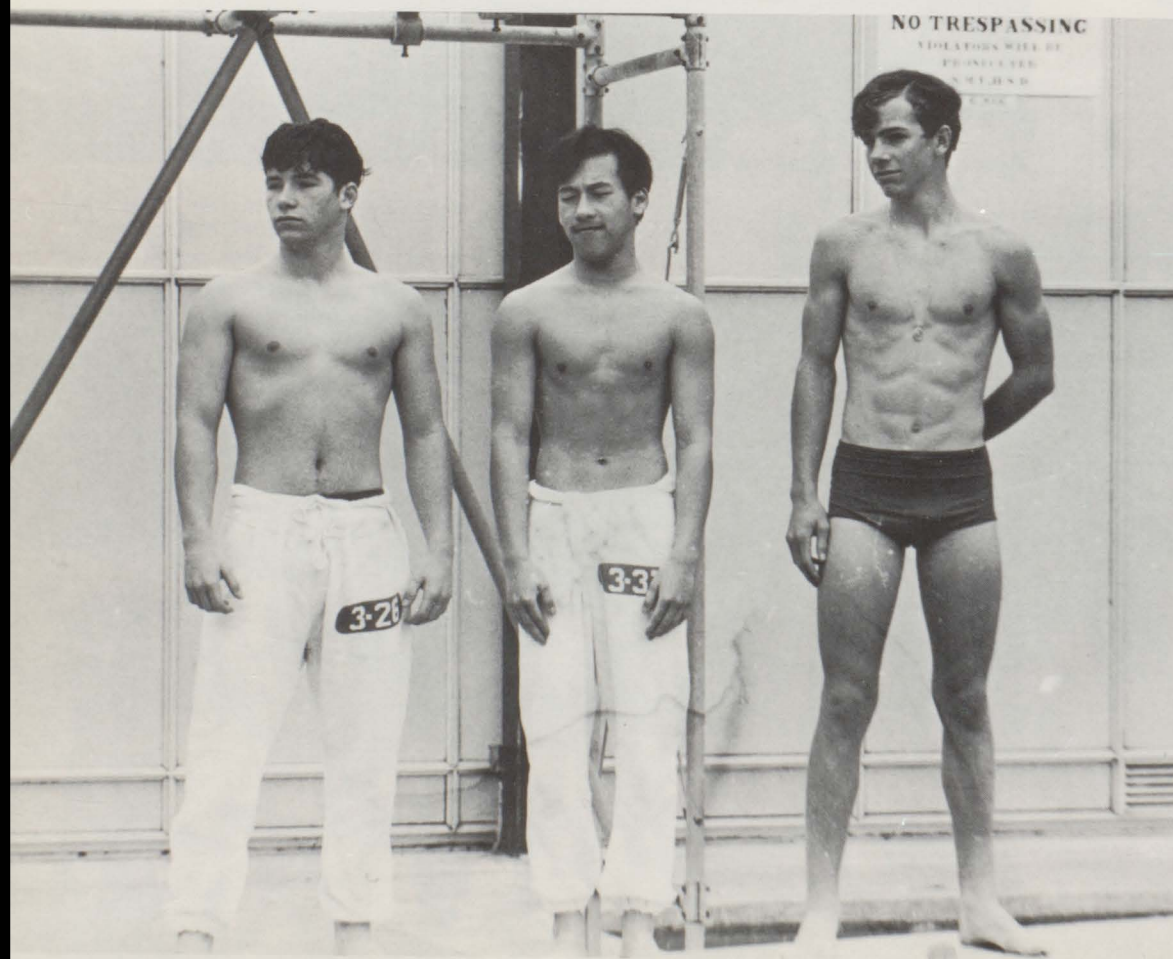

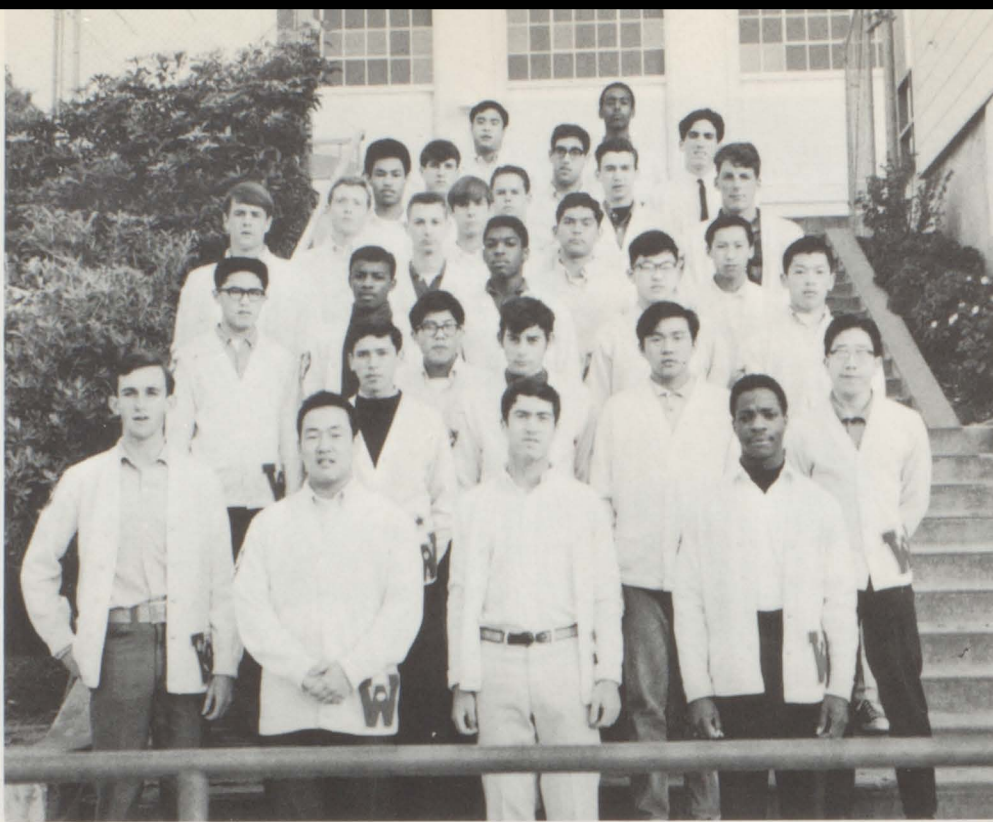

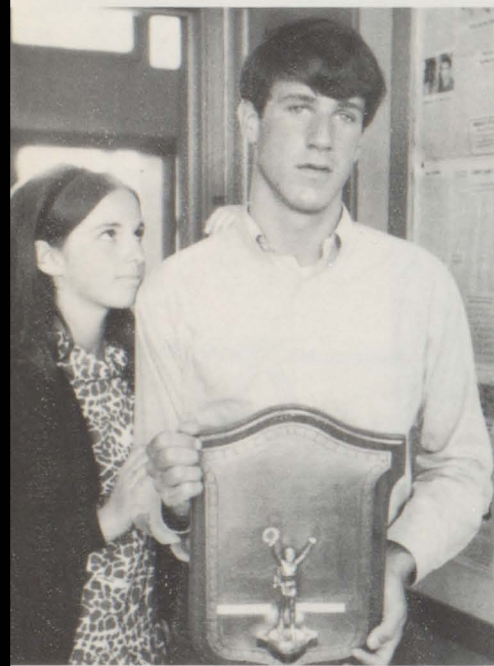

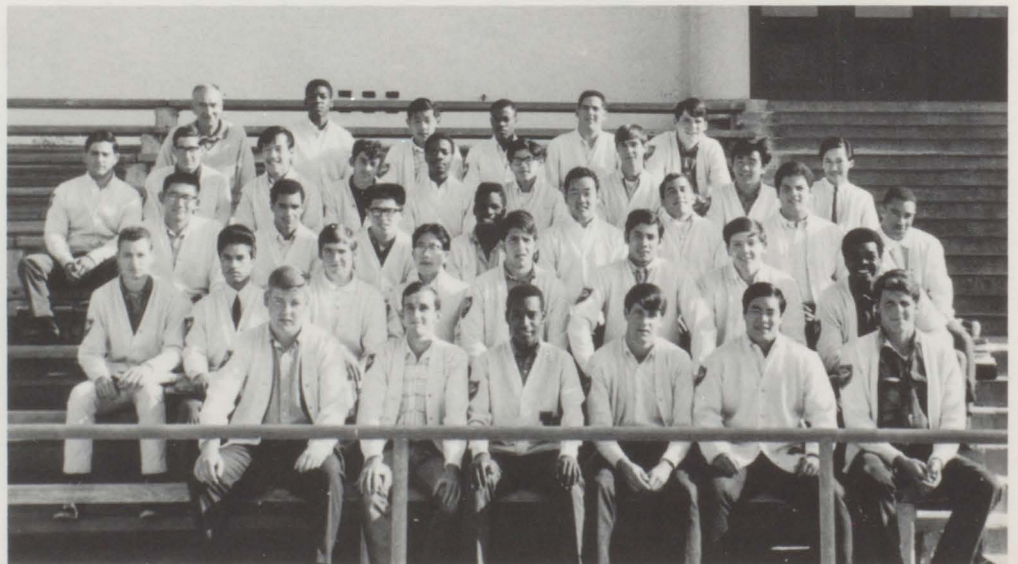

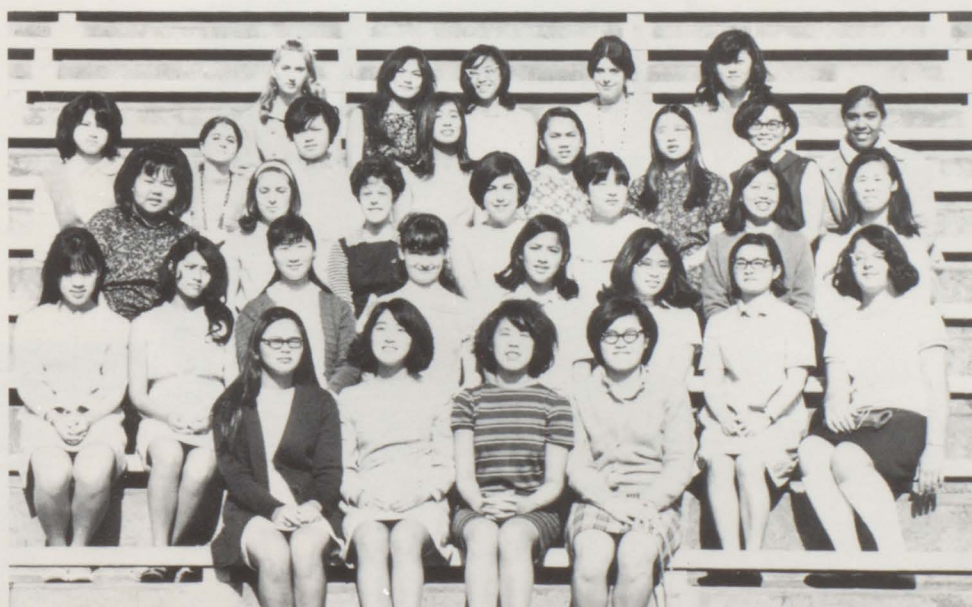

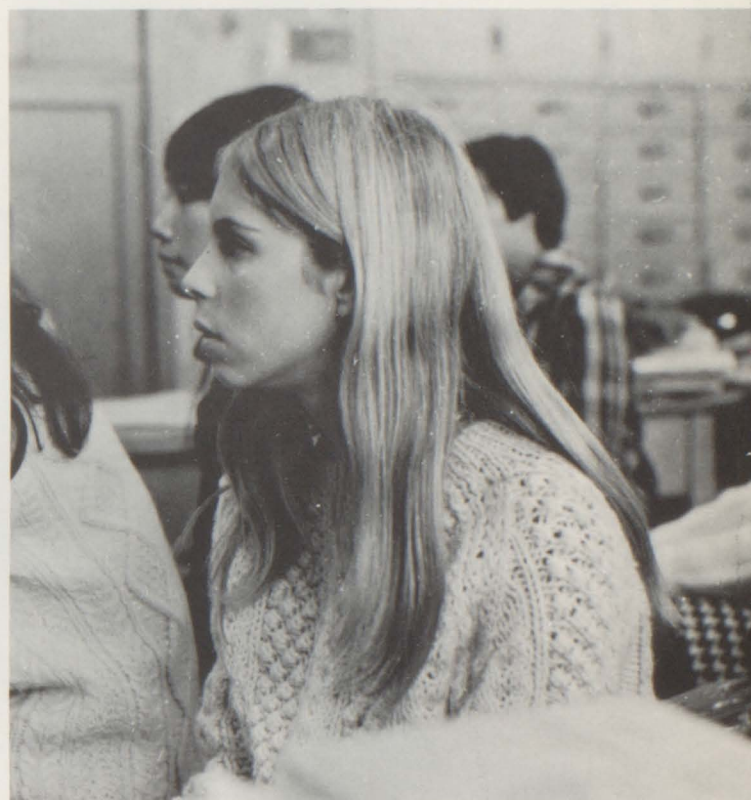

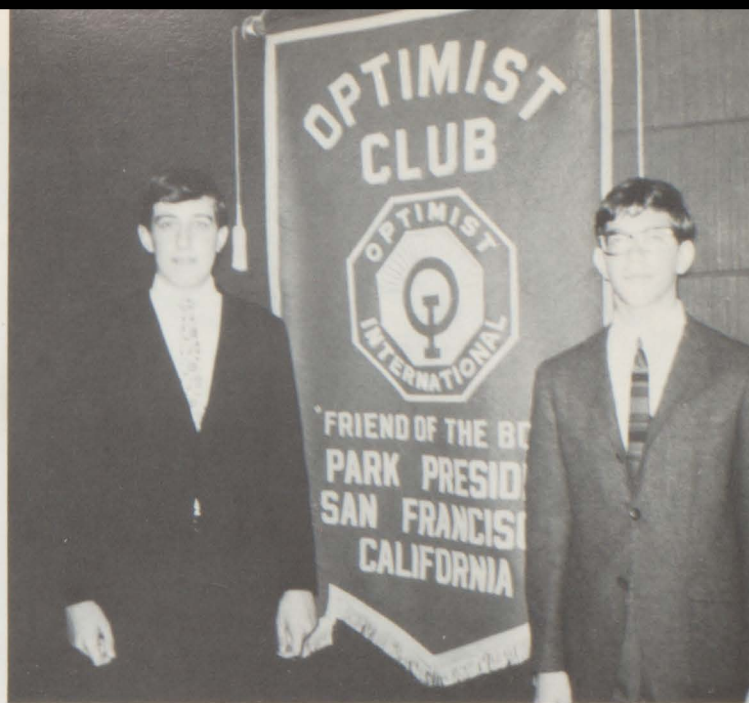

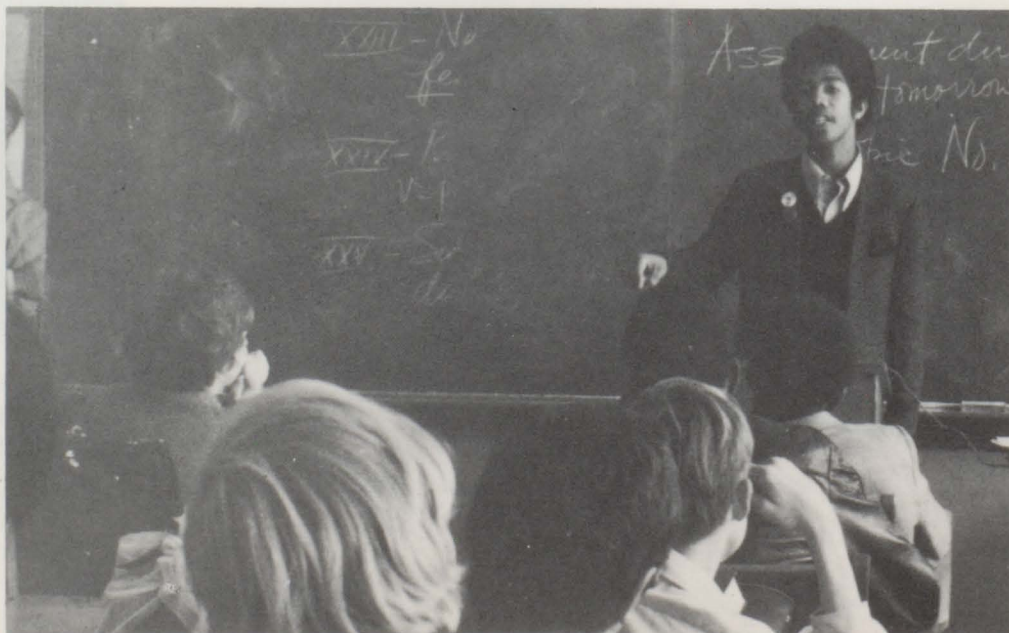

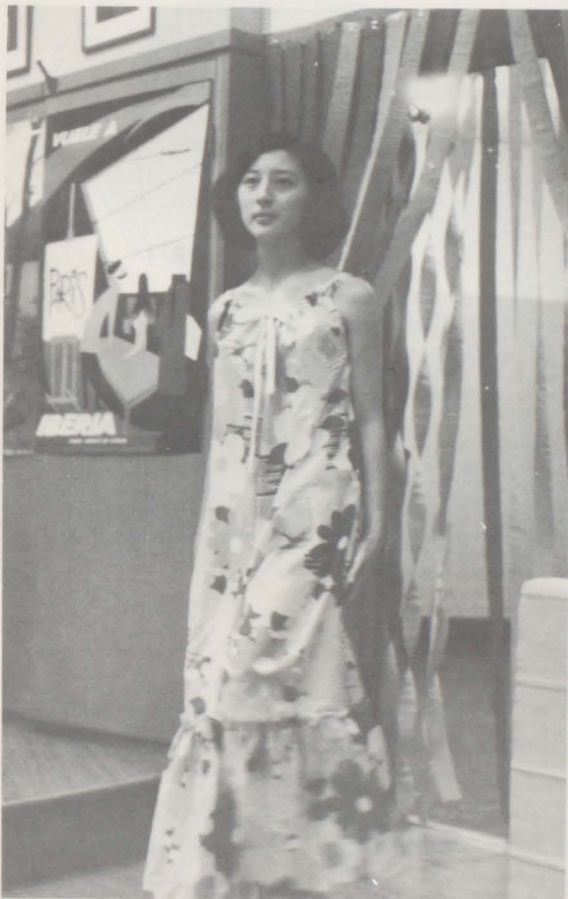
Clubs, Students, Involvement

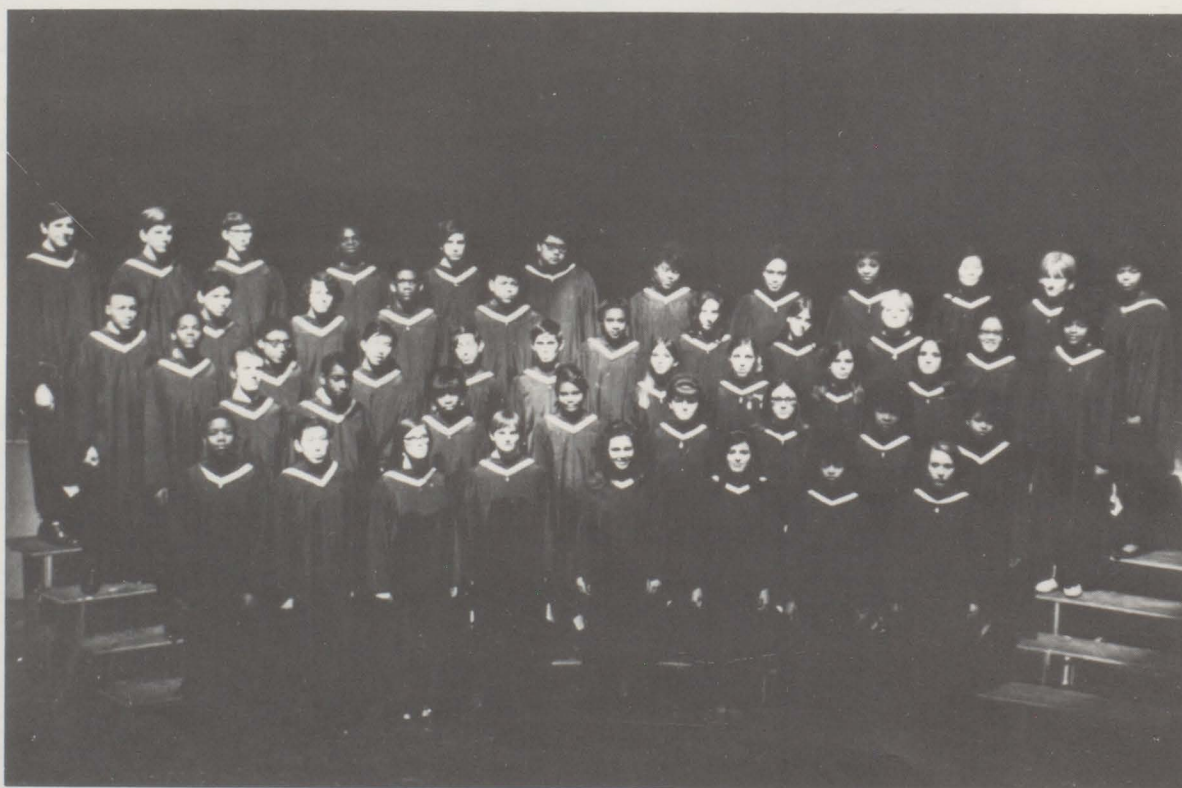

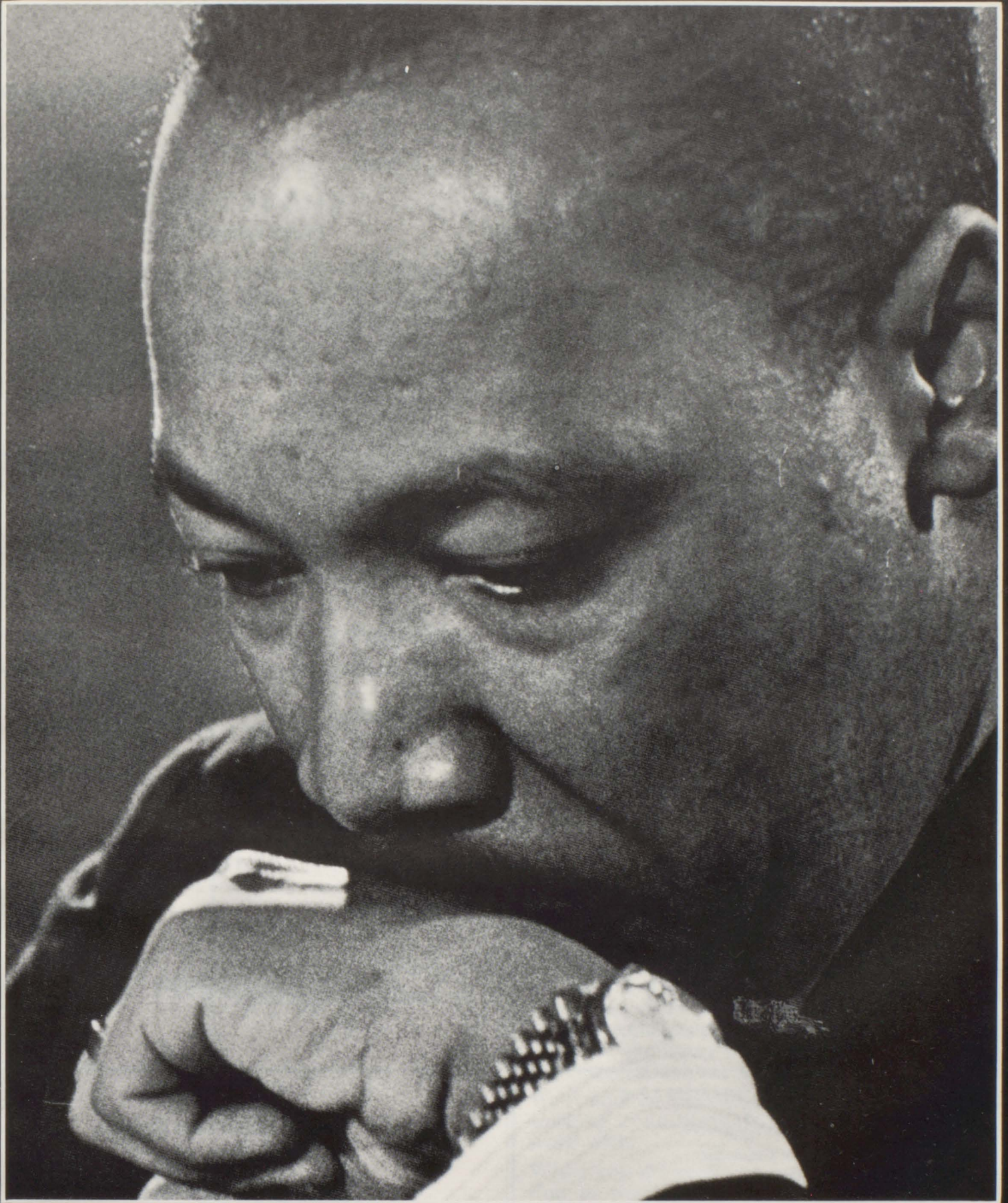
