Biard picked up a fumble return to leave the score 33-7.

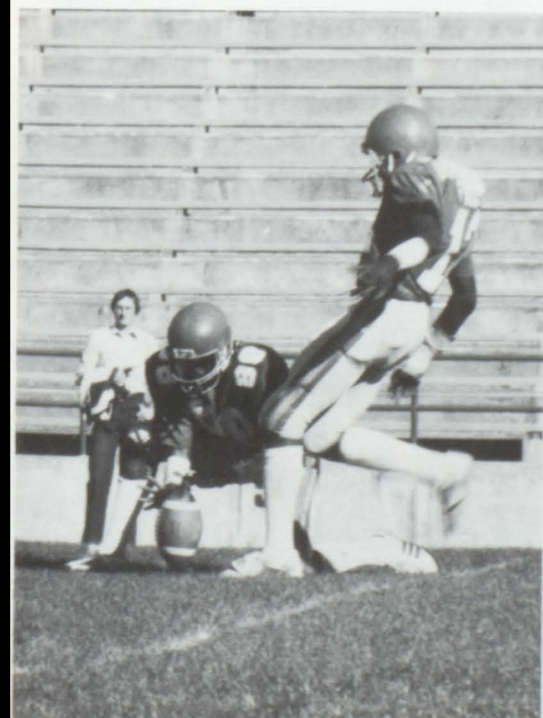

The Eagles only loss in the season was against Wilson. The Warriors won 57-49 in overtime.

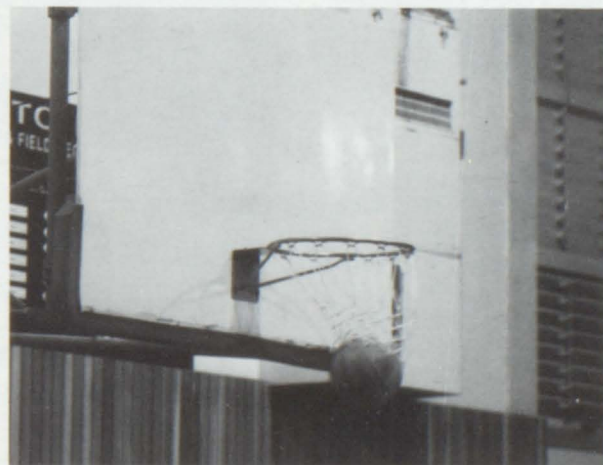
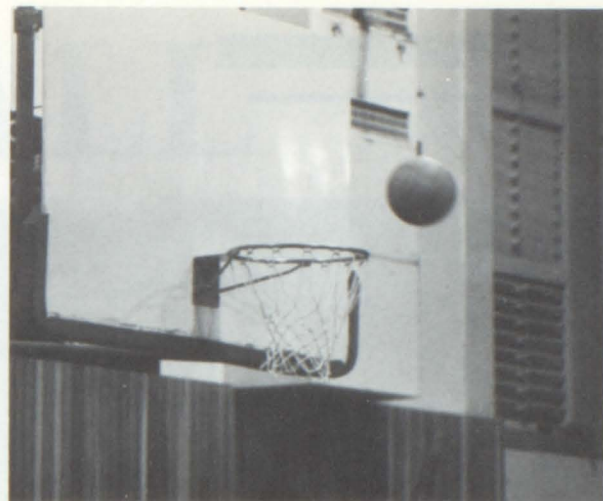
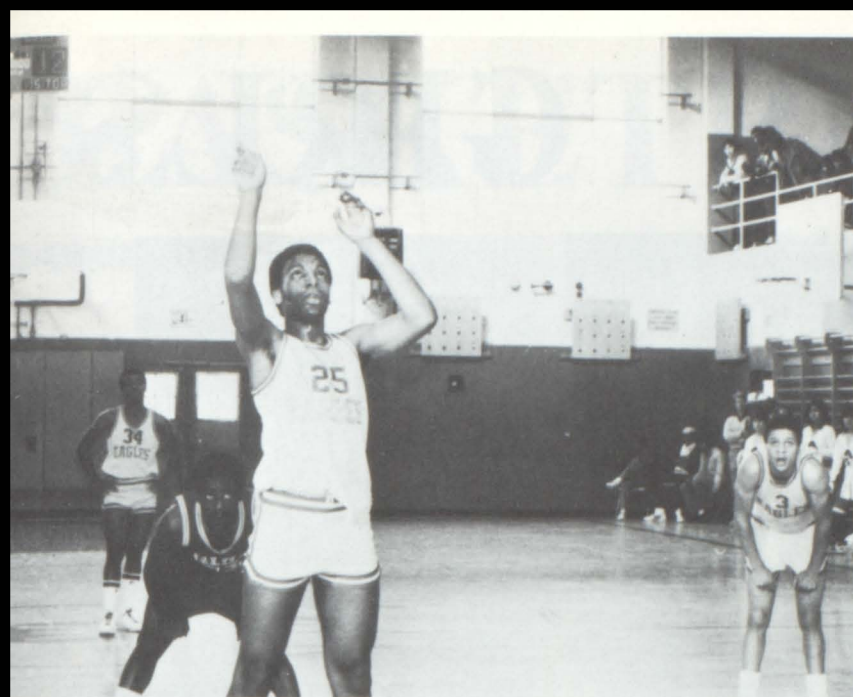
In the play-offs, it was a rematch against Wilson, and the Eagles were prepared. With revenge on their minds, due to losing to Wilson

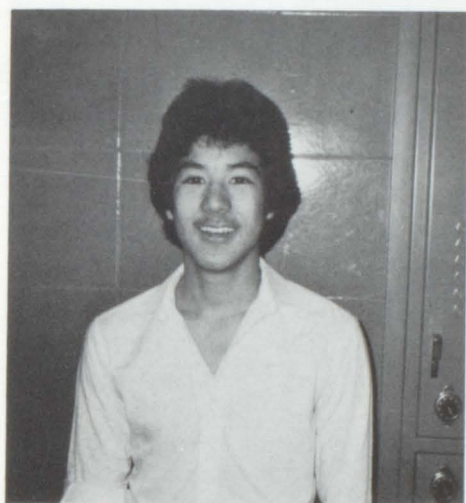


# HALL OF FAME
