
















#### Class of 83's Dance! "Get It Up and Let's Groove"
























#### **ROUND ROBIN CHAMPIONS**


Biard picked up a fumble return to leave the score 33-7.

The Eagles only loss in the season was against Wilson. The Warriors won 57-49 in overtime.



#### SUPER BOWL CHAMPS






