
Graduates of the Tech course would be eligible for two and four year programs in Technical institutes.


\$30,000 was granted by the Roseberg Foundation of San Francisco for the programs of Ells and De Anza.

Visitors such as industrial engineers and representatives, University representatives, and various Bay Area school officials observed the class in action.





FOOTBALL SYNOPSIS

1962 - 1963

This second year under Head Coach Lee Schroeder turned out to be another successful year for the Eagles' Red Machine, which has in past years ended up on the bottom of the heap. By decisively taking the last five games straight (and a non-league contest with Oakland Tech.) the mighty single-wing crew finished third in the A.C.A.L., one of the toughest leagues around anywhere.

"The worst (the beginning of the season, that is) and the best team I've ever coached." So says Coach Schroeder, who after ironing out early-season wrinkles put on the field one of the hottest teams

in the Bay Area.

The Eagles were led again this year by stalwart fullback Carl Bradford (All A.C.A.L. pick for the 2nd year), and also up-and-coming Rick Cortese (a Junior who will be back next year—along with 14 other lettermen—to lead the Eagles for title contention). Travis Williams (1st defensive team) and

Durrey Haynes (2nd defensive team) were others who along with Bradford made All League.

After losing the opener to rival foe El Cerrito on fumbles and mistakes which were "chalked up" to inexperience, the Eagles came back strong, beating Oakland Tech. 26-6. The Red and White Machine was then halted by the invincible Alamedans and the single-wing was clipped 26-0. Then on some "Black Friday" the Eagles went down in heart- rending defeat to Berkeley 25-0, though outclassing the Yellowjackets on first downs and total net yards. From then on there was no stopping the single-winged Eagles. The Ells gridders rolled over their last five opponents (including traditional foes, De Anza 26-7 and Richmond 13-0), giving them a 6-3 record and earning them the third-place berth in League standings.

This year marked another first in Ells' grid history. The long-sought-for stadium was finally finished and the Eagles played two games on their new Nicholl Park home-field (both were winners


against Encinal and Richmond).

BASKETBALL 1963

At the end of the 1962 basketball season there was a complete departure of varsity lettermen. Not one player would be back for 1963. There seemed little hope for a championship team when the 1963 season finally began. The season looked promising, as the Eagles won their first three league games behind the scoring of such unknowns as Carl Adams and Gary Lloyd. Jumping Bill Overstreet added the "class" of a winning club. But the Eagles were small, with little experience and ended the first half with four losses. The second half nearly started like the first, with the Eagles winning three out of their first four games. But this was a new club with the addition of 6' 5" Wesley Russel, the long-needed "big man" that most clubs have. The fast-breaking Eagles went on to finish the second half

of the A.C.A.L. campaign with only two losses. The deciding game that prevented the Eagles from entering the TOC was the rematch with Berkeley. At the end of that game there was little talking in the dressing room, until Coach Kamb, with a nonchalant smile, wrote one word on the blackboard: GRIDLEY.

The Eagles entered Gridley one Thursday afternoon as underdogs to Encinal and Bishop O'Dowd. The first night the Eagles came from behind a deficit of 9 points to beat the hustling San Jose cagers. The Eagles immediately gained the support of the Gridley fans. The following evening was the big test. Could the Ells quintet take a club that had won 38 out of its last 39 games? It seemed improbable. But the final was 54 to 48 in favor of Ells. The Eagles had come from 10 points behind to win.

The crowd loved the spectacular Billy Overstreet, the consistent Carl Adams, and the rebounding of Gary Lloyd and Wesley Russell. The big night finally came—the championship game against the highly favored O'Dowd five. At the half the Eagles found themselves 9 points behind. But at the end of the second half the Eagles had "found themselves" and were 9 points in the lead. Ells had won the G.I.B.T. 69-60, with Carl Adams and Billy Overstreet scoring 26 points apiece. Overstreet and Adams were chosen for the All-Tourney Team.

The Harry Ells High School Eagles had ended the 1963 basketball season by bringing home a championship trophy.




CROSS COUNTRY





"Arriving, San Francisco Airport August 28th, 10:00, T.W.A." This telegram told us Jayashree Kokatay from Bombay, India was at last arriving after many delays. Our family stood at that airport window expecting a piece of India to get off the plane, a sari-clad something that was a little mysterious, with long dark hair and big eyes and all the serenity of Ghandi. Instead a very frightened and tired little bird in a tourquoise sari met us timidly.

My sister, Jai and I have become very close. I think it may be because she likes Ray Charles! We have exchanged so much, though; now I wear saris and she wears pants. Both she and Susan (my other sister) love to paint and we all hate to do the dishes.

If only I could tell you what has happened since Jai has been with us — but the only way you'll really know is to apply for a foreign student yourself.
