Its short-lived waves of joy and woe.


Lips must fade and roses wither,

Can prove of immortality.




EARLY CONSTRUCTION on the Eucalyptus sight. Auditorium is top right. Gyms at bottom left.






LANDSCAPING and construction of Lowell's facade.





"Lowell" still exists at the corner of Hayes & Ashbury streets. No, I'm not referring to the old Lowell Building (now the site of John Adams Adult School)...I mean the Lowell Pharmacy at 1901 Hayes Street. This historic pharmacy is identified only by a red sign with "Lowell" printed in white block lettering.

The Lowell Pharmacy was almost a "second home" to the scores of students and faculty who frequented the establishment. Mr. Mehdy, who has operated the Pharmacy since 1921, not only sold school supplies and operated the "Lowell Fountain", he also was a "second counselor" to many Lowell students.

Mr. Milton, a Lowell allumnus from the "old building", still stops of Mr. Mehdy's store once in a while during driver's training. "Mr. Mehdy was Lowell's first para-professional counselor," said Mr. Milton, remembering days past, "He has convinced many students of the folly of cutting."

Mr. Mehdy's soda Fountain, which was located at the rear of his pharmacy, was the cleanest of the four "creameries" (that's 60-ish talk for "icecream parlors") on Hayes Street near Lowell. Though Mr. Mehdy would not tolerate roughousing or littering in his store, he was "like a kind grandfather" to those who treated his shop with respect. Other "creameries" often had trouble with Lowell students-one had so much trouble, it had to close during school hours.

Mr. Mehdy's pharmacy has changed little since he opened it in 1933. The largest change, the removal of the eight-stool soda fountain, occurred one week after the last class graduated from the "old Lowell" in June of 1962. The original 1933 indoor phone booth still stands next to a "your weight here" scale of the same era. Glass counters, dark

wood paneling, and very modest florescent lighting complete the effect of sending one back in time.

Mr. Mehdy's large neighborhood prescription business was one reason he did not move near the "new" Lowell in 1962. Mr. Mehdy stopped prescriptions last year, but he still sells non-prescription drugs, school supplies, magazines, and other drug-store items.

Mr. Mehdy had "a wonderful time with Lowell."














California Scholarship Federation

others that benefitted from the Red Cross were patients at Letterman Hospital. The group also met during the vacation at the U.C. Medical Center to help decorate Christmas trees.


German Club

MUSIC

The Lowell Music Department, composed of instrumental, vocal, and theory classes, is one of the major co-curricular areas of the school. Besides performing groups, the department offers two academic courses: Jazz Workshop, an experimental class that introduces students to the history, performance, composition, and cultural impact of jazzmusic, and AP Music, which deals mainly with classical music and its facets.

Also in the music program are the weekly Noon Concerts, sponsored by Mrs. Stella Michaelian, which give talented students the opportunity to perform alone or in groups. Highlights of this series also included a preview of an orchestra concert and a performance of Lowell faculty members.

The Lowell Orchestra, the largest high school orchestra in San Francisco, ranks among the top youth orchestras in the nations. This year, the group, under the direction of Mr. Jack Pereira, performed three concerts in the Lowell auditorium, as well as participating in the Holiday Festival.

Other engagements included concerts at Scottish Rite Auditorium, Grace Cathedral, and Golden Gate Park. The Orchestra also attended a reception for Maestro Seiji Ozawa and the San Francisco Symphony.

Lowell's Symphonic Band members felt honored by receiving the highest possible award for their outstanding performance at the California Music Educators Association festival held in April. The Band, conducted by Mr. Paul Zahtilla and students Floyd Reinhart and Tony Mazzaferro, had a busy concert season, beginning with football games and rallies, a program a Luther Burbank Junior High, and an eight a.m. concert of Christmas music in the Lowell courtyard during December.

POP, STAGE BANDS

In the Spring, the Pop Band played numerous concerts for civic events to earn money for the Band Blazer Fund.

The Stage Band, under Mark Estebez, appeared at Zellerbach Plaza, in a program of jazz music and again in Happy Days '73 with the Symphonic Band. The "Bearcats" from The Boyfriend and the musicians in The Importance of Being Earnest were band students. And to round out each semester, the combined Sophomore, Concert, Symphonic, and Stage Bands presented joint concerts at Lowell.



CHORAL

The Choral Department is led by Mr. John Land, who transferred to Lowell last September. A versatile director and talented musician, Mr. Land has in one year revamped the choral department to include four lively vocal classes, offering everything from classical music to the musical theater.

LOWELL VARSITY FOOTBALL

Character was the mark of the championship team which defeated Wilson High, 15-0, in Candlestick Park on Turkey Day 1972. This attribute possessed the Lowell High Indians from the beginning to end, through thick and thin, from a near-disastrous decline toward the end of the round robin to an ascension to the glory of a championship.

Coach Ed Burns, who made life a little painful and frustrating at times for the players, is one reason the team went as far as they did. The other major factor was that this team was working toward one end, and that end of was rewarded on Thanksgiving Day.

A look at the team shows that its forte was defense. The Indians lived or died on defense. This unit of the team was headed by middle linebacker Dave Bon, and outside backers Phil Vercammen and Mark Gamble. The front four consisted of Bruce Barker, Mike Alexander, Walt Laughridge, and Al Toeaina. All but Barker were named to all-city first teams. The defensive backfield of Dennis Barfield, Dave Zouzounis, Bruce Powell, and Kevin Austin was rarely seen burned.

Offense. Handled by quarterback Tom Kopas and Themi Tjovenos. Most of the yardage gained through the entire season came from fullback Dave Van Winkle, half-backs Kevin Austin and Dennis Barfield. Van Winkle was the most enduring runner around as he was always up the middle for 3, 4, or 5 yards. His drive and determination along with a countless amount of effort were assets which led the Indians to score. Kevin Austin, quick and inconsistent, when able to shake loose around end or off tackle, was almost unstoppable.

Injuries always hurt a team. Lowell was no exception as Dennis Barfield was the most major loss for the team. His period of inactivity offensively from the second half of the Westmoor game to the start of the Washington game may have cost Lowell countless scores. In the season which should have been his finest, Barfield suffered a broken wrist in the first game. Barfield's ability could be measured as a comfination of both Var Winkle and Austin. His open field speed plus the power and determination of Van Winkle would have made him the best back in the city, plus the depth in the backfield which Lowell needed so desperately. His return to the offensive end of the gridiron in the Washinton game was a smashing success. He scored three touchdowns in addition to making 130 yards in 13 carries. This lift seemed to carry the Indians through the playoffs and on to the rewarding championship which was rightfully won.


SOCCER TEAM BEST IN YEARS













AN OVERALL VIEW ...

Without the benefit of having the league's best player as in the two previous years, the 1972-1973 Lowell Varsity Basketball Team languished through a losing season. As not all was good, obviously, not all was sordid. The season provided its bright spots, and it can be said that things could have been worse.

Starting in the fall with Mr. Gus Buono at coach, the overall pre-league record was a thoroughly unimpressive 5-9, though it was brightened by an upset of the eventval Mid-Peninsula League Champion, Mills. It was not so much the record, though, but the inability of the varsity to come together as a team that left the outlook for the AAA season dark.

It would be unfair to say that Lowell lacked talent - they just did not win with it. Too small to play playground-style, the varsity had to adjust by playing a consistent organized game. 


The Lowell High Varsity baseball team took the city championship for the second year in a row, beating rival Lincoln in a tense contest, 6-5.

Stan Mason, placed in centerfield defensively, made an ideal leadoff man, either hitting his way onto the basepaths or working opposing pitchers for the base on balls.




MARK JEE AND VARSITY TENNIS NO. 1!







The past year has been a memorable one. Lowell has managed to survive through one more year on its beautiful, spacious campus. Lowell still holds its name as the oldest high school in San Francisco as it approaches its one hundred and twenty - eighth year in existence.

The 1972-1973 school population was well over capacity. We can all vouch for this. At one time or another you were all in a hurry to a class and BOOM you found yourself caught in a traffic jam. The bell rang and there you stood pushing and shoving and cramped up for another two minutes. You tiptoed into class and hid your face hoping that the teacher hadn't observed your tardiness.

Passbook sales were off to a start with the beginning of the school year. The popularized student identification card died and \$4.50 would purchase the "Lowell Student-Community Participation Passbook."

This book supposedly amounted to a cash value of over \$125.00 and additional discounts were added during the school year.

No one will forget the unique Lowell fire drill. Beep, beep, ..., students sat attentively with their ears perked up industriously counting the bells. Passing out of the building was not allowed until twenty-five distinct hells were were heard. In the meantime the east end of the building very well could have been in the process of burning to the ground. Toward the end of the school year our traditional expertise in fire drills returned.

October 13 was a tragic moment in the history of Lowell High School. A racial disagreement turned to turmoil in the central courtyard and five students were stabbed viciously and rushed to the emergency hospital. No one was critically injured.

November was a busy month. The senior class sponsored a dance on the bay which was a huge success. Turkey Day was a victorious day for the students of Lowell High School. The Indians put up a fight against the Warriors as the spirited student body and alumni cheered them on. Candlestick Park was a white cloud at the end of the game.

November 7, 1972, Nixon was re-elected president. Mixed emotions were noted through the city of San Francisco. Peace became a reality within a two month period after the inauguration of the President. Soon after, POW's began their long journey home. Many families awaited the arrival of their loved ones at Travis Air Force Base as well as various other military bases scattered throughout the United States. Shipyards started to close and many people lost their jobs as the

December started off with the smashing production of "The Boyfriend." The Lowell Auditorium was overcrowded with spectators wishing to "get in" and find out about this overwhelming drama production.

Soft, fluffy white snow fell on the streets of San Francisco for the first time in ten years. The frost-bitten air nipped at the bare arms, faces, and hands of the Bay Area residents. Children ran up and down the sidewalks wild with joy. Tears of happiness rolled down the red frozen cheeks of many.

Most of the Lowell student body shared the frightening experience of taking the horrifying college exams this past year. Students from Lowell as well as other high schools throughout the country make a crucial decision in their lives during their senior year--how to spend the rest of their lives. Sophomores, juniors, and seniors have all competed in a variety of different college tests within this past year.

Now Lowell lives on preparing hundreds and hundreds of students for their future struggles in the life ahead whether it be college or the world of hard labor.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

More than a year ago when answering the routine journalism final exam question--How would you change or improve the yearbook?, Ed Belale wrote, "Do not worry about the 1973 yearbook. I will work to make it the best photographic record of the year possible." He was given the job.

At one time that job would have meant calling the professional yearbook photographers (at an hourly rate) to school every time an event needed coverage, lining up team and club shots for the 'pro' to take, ordering prints from him (and waiting for them). Next, page layouts would have been drawn and shipped (one page per envelope) with photos and copy to be set in type for a faraway 'plant.' This year every picture was taken and processed by students (except the mug shots), every word of copy was typed as it appears in the book, and every page was pasted up by the staff. Result: a saving of ten dollars per page and a staff that went through the satisfying and educational experience of constructing a book, with all the decisions and problems--aesthetic and practical--involved.

Jeanette Huie and Jerry Wong kept their eyes and his camera and photographic crew on the Fall '72 semester, getting most of the reg shots out of the way and accumulating calendar facts and photo coverage of events, and then continued into Spring '73. When sales time came, Jon deGroot and Carol Kern handled almost \$9000 without misplacing a penny. Linda Nanbu became assistant editor through sheer devotion—hours of pasting, typing, and section organizing (into the summer). Terry Moore, who would have been newspaper editor (baseball had priorities), put together a lively sport section—the most complete in years. Sue Magidson, with more experience than any, having worked on the book since her sophomore year, oversaw the mug shot pages—seniors and underclassmen—with help from Teresita Reyes.

Along with the senior photographers, non-staffer Martin Jeong and newspaper editor-to-be Matt Wilson spent hours in the dark room producing some of the excellent pictures for this book. Ray Ju, an extremely talented and often un-by-lined photographer, was responsible for the drama production shots, many team pictures, and a good number of the sharp candids throughout the book. Barney Wolf (the only non-student cameraman) covered cross country and track with his rich prints.


An unusual faculty section created by Denise Fahey should amuse readers and teachers, and yards of typing flowed out of the two IBM's in room 251 under the flying fingers of Lorina Lee, Mabel Fok, and any one of the staff who had time to spend.

Although the entire Lowell community cooperates with the RED & WHITE, Alice Scanlon in the main office deserves a gold patience medal for the thousands of telephone calls she handles in relation to the book, and Adele Selig, the summer overseer of mail and phones, gets a giant 'thank you' for her astute forwarding of emergency messages. All in all some twenty seniors (and a handlful of juniors) poured their energies (after dealing with academic requirements) into the 320 pages of information and activities that are this yearbook. The omissions and errors are the spots they missed, and the staff apologizes for them to the readers and to the editor, for he hoped for a perfect book.

Editor Ed Belale began with talent and desire, and he meets the final deadline with the technical knowhow of preparing for publication AND a much better understanding of human nature—having guided and questioned and goaded his staff to the levels of perfection that he sets for himself. Photos went back to the photographers to be improved in contrast or focus or composition. Copy went back to be made more complete. Photographers repeated assignments and tracked down hard-to-catch teachers until Ed was satisfied that the quality of his book (time limits considered) was as high as possible. His own contributions, besides quality control, appear in drawings, photos, general layout, special events, and songs. A year of his life has been dominated by this book, but he has the warm feeling of accomplishment. His reward will be the smile on the face of a reader, the exclamation of a senior as he looks at his section, the delight in the hearts of the many students who find their year mirrored in the 1973 RED & WHITE.
