Much luck and happiness goes to Mr. Knowles who, at the completion of this semester, is leaving us on a sabbatical leave in quest of his doctor's degree.







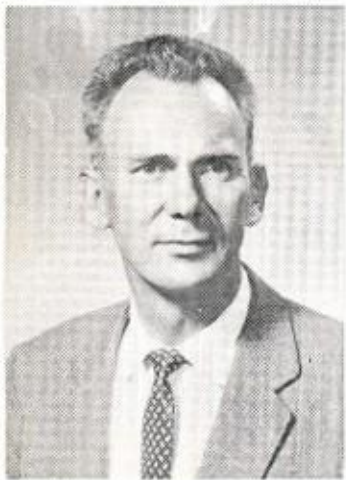

To end a terrific football season, which had lots of thrills and chills, was Jerry Vetrano, Head Yell Leader, who led us with good school spirit.

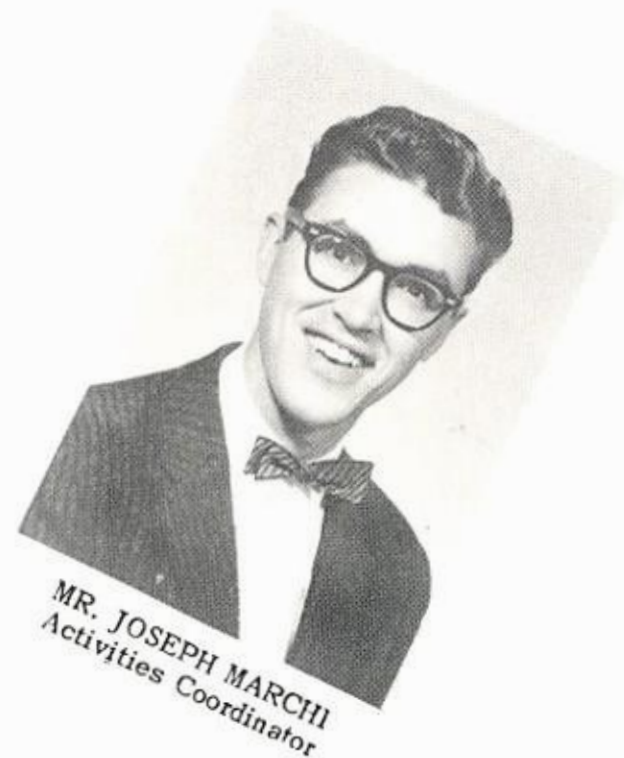

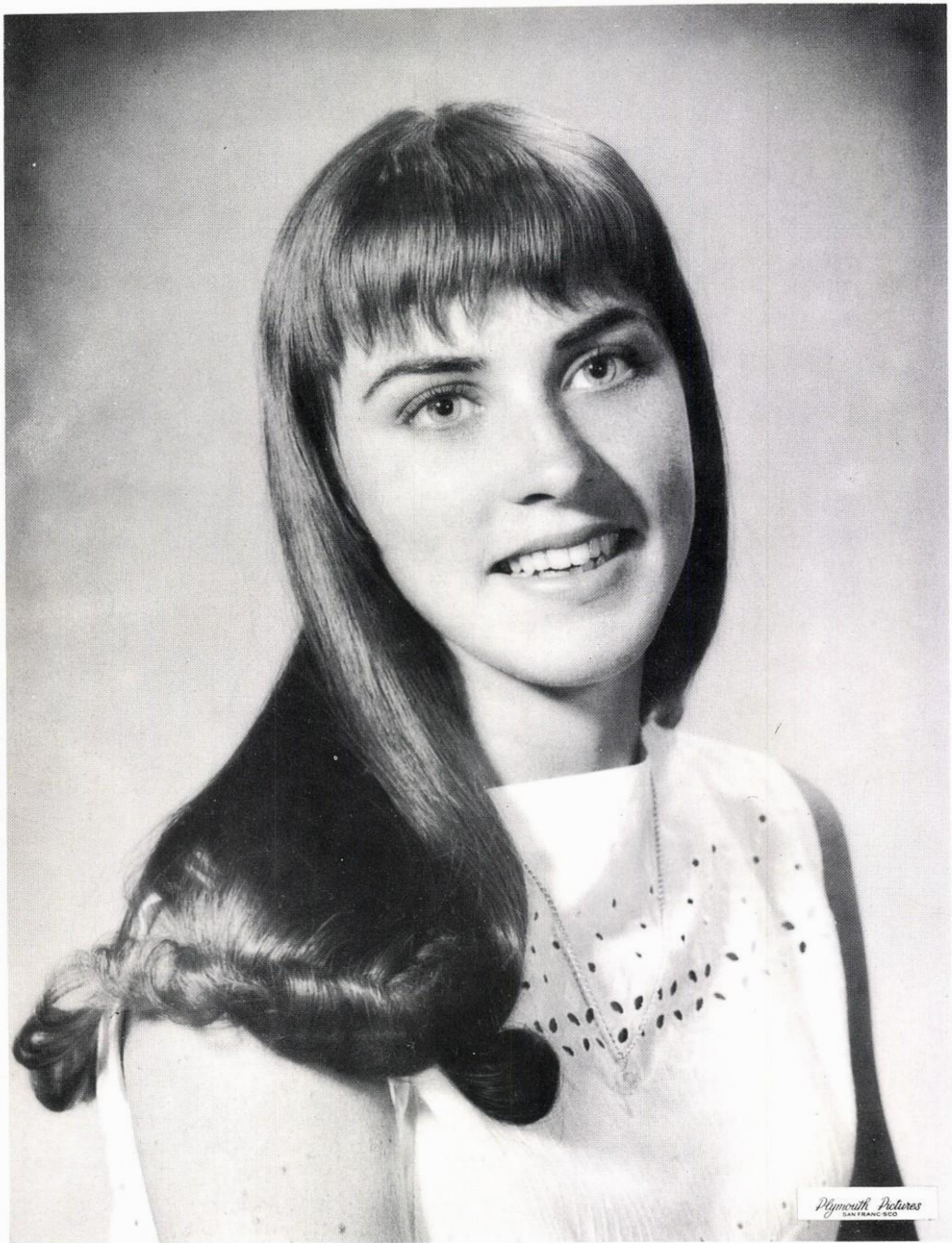

Mission's Mighty Bears wound up the 1959 Prep Football Season with a not so mighty record of only one victory in eight games. 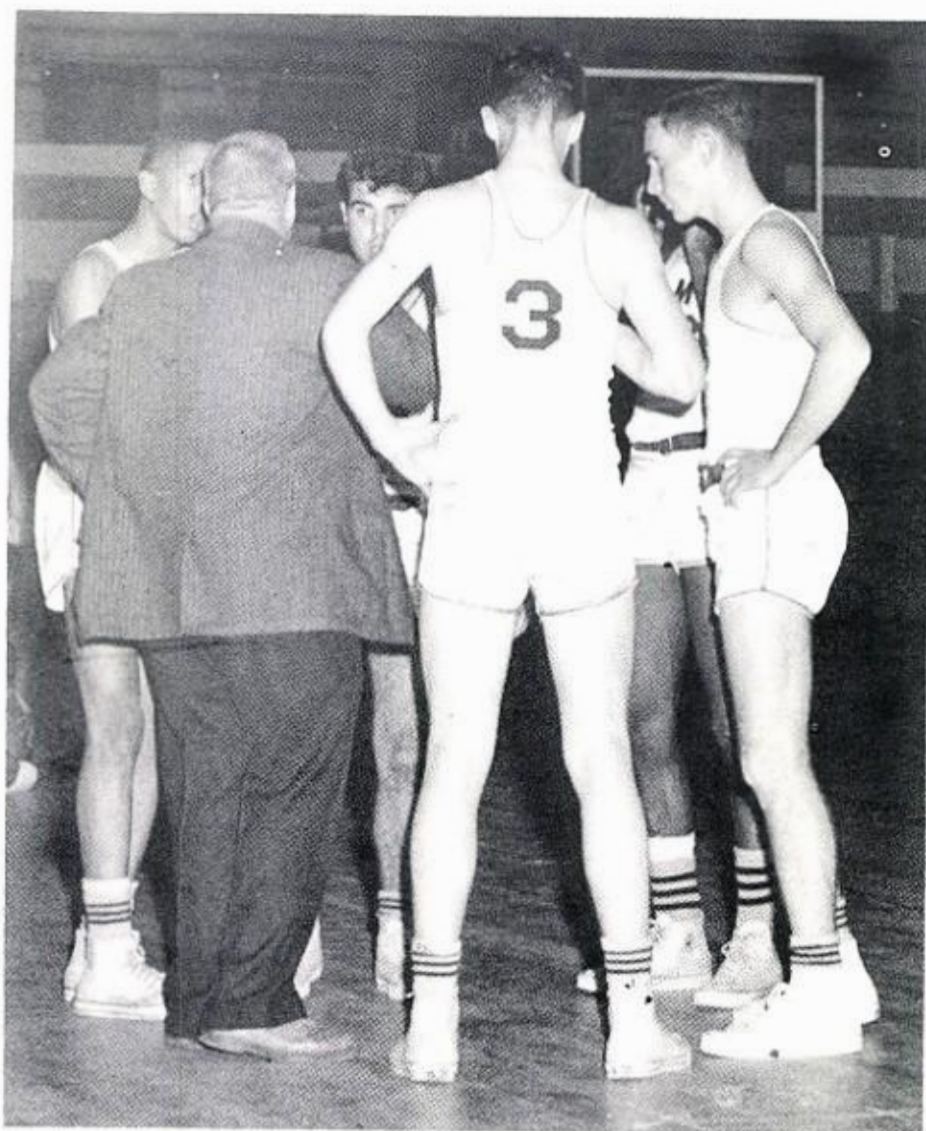
In comparison to other years, Mission's Varsity Basketball team was not a complete success. Mission won one game and lost seven, putting them in last place.

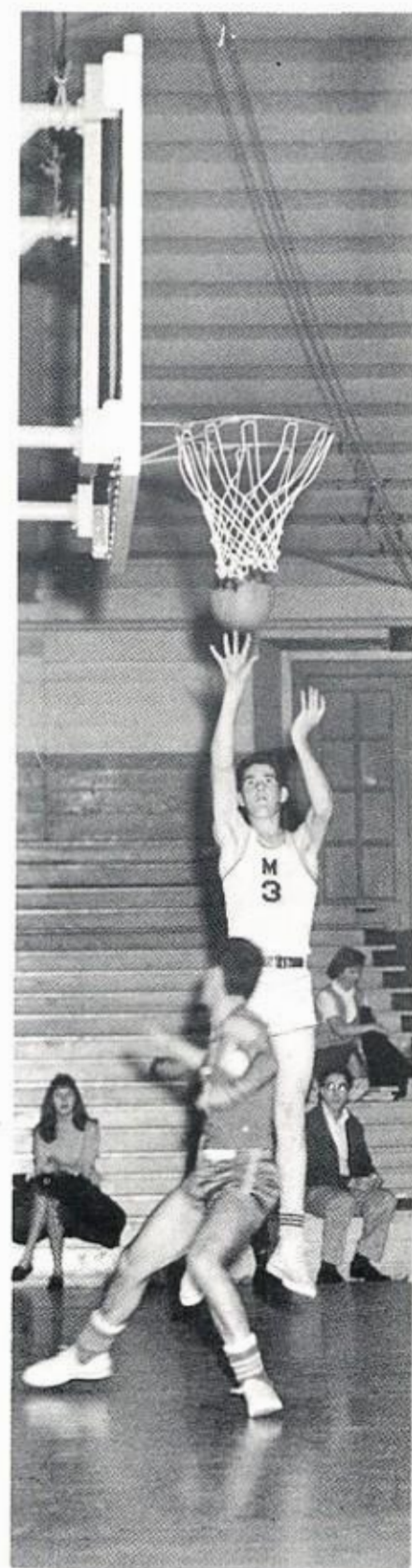

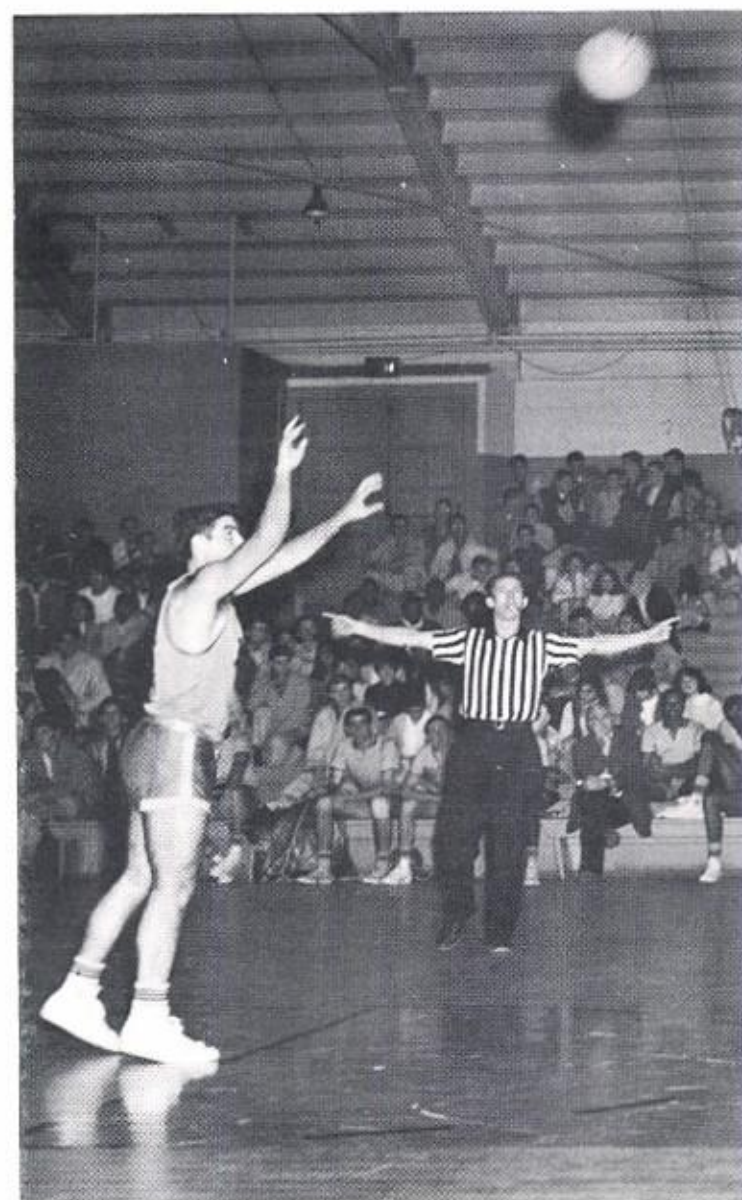

# HORSEHIDERS WERE INCONSISTENT



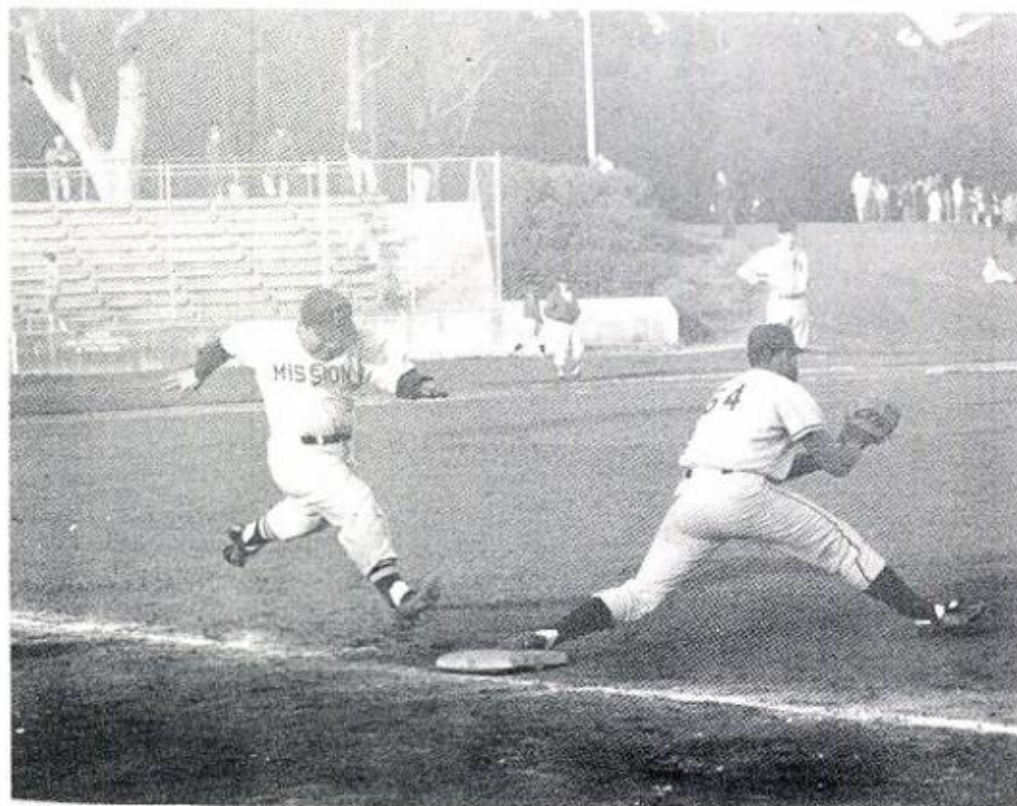
It's the first run for the Bears of the young 1960 season. The game was a heart-breaking loss to Poly, 9-7.

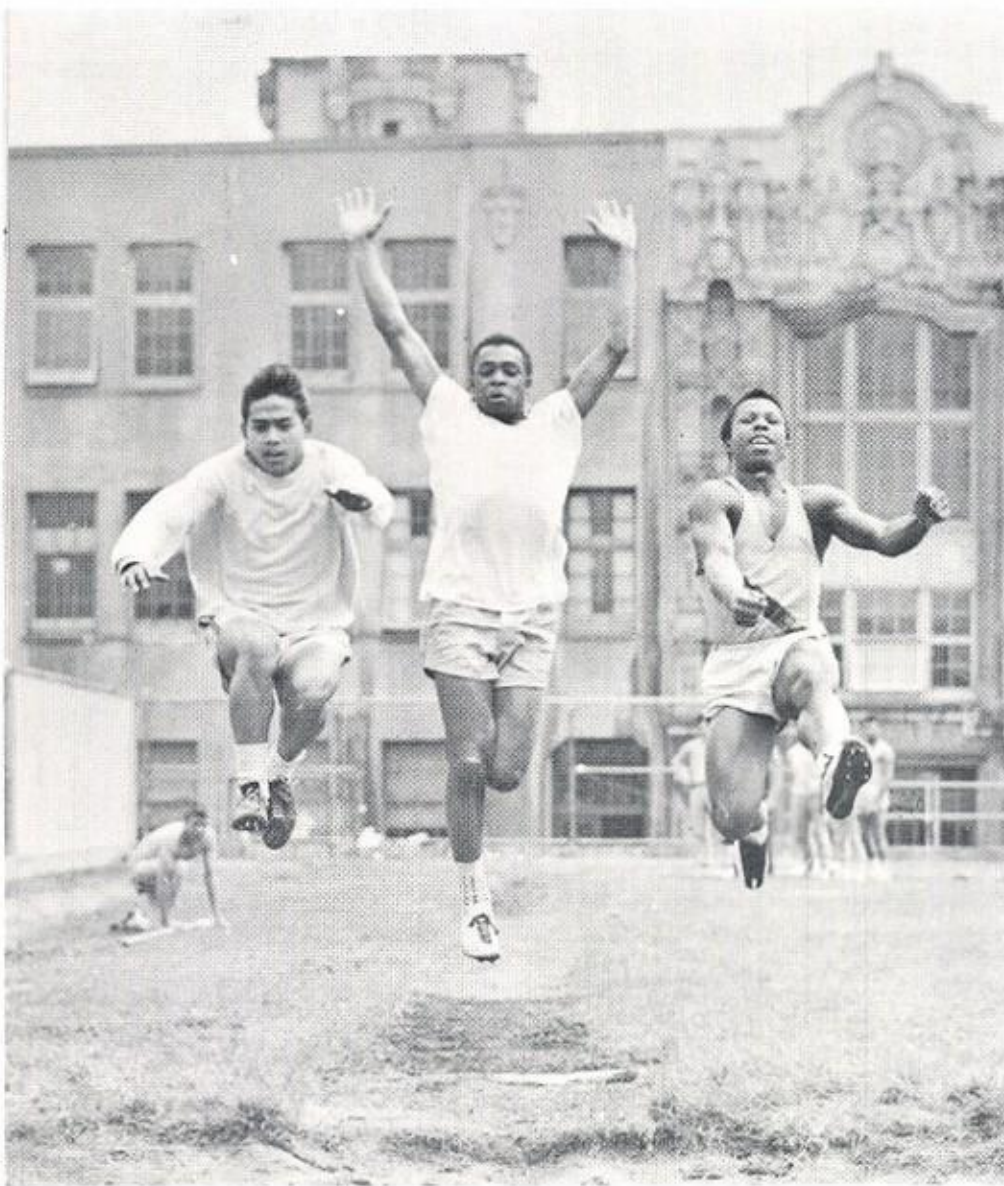

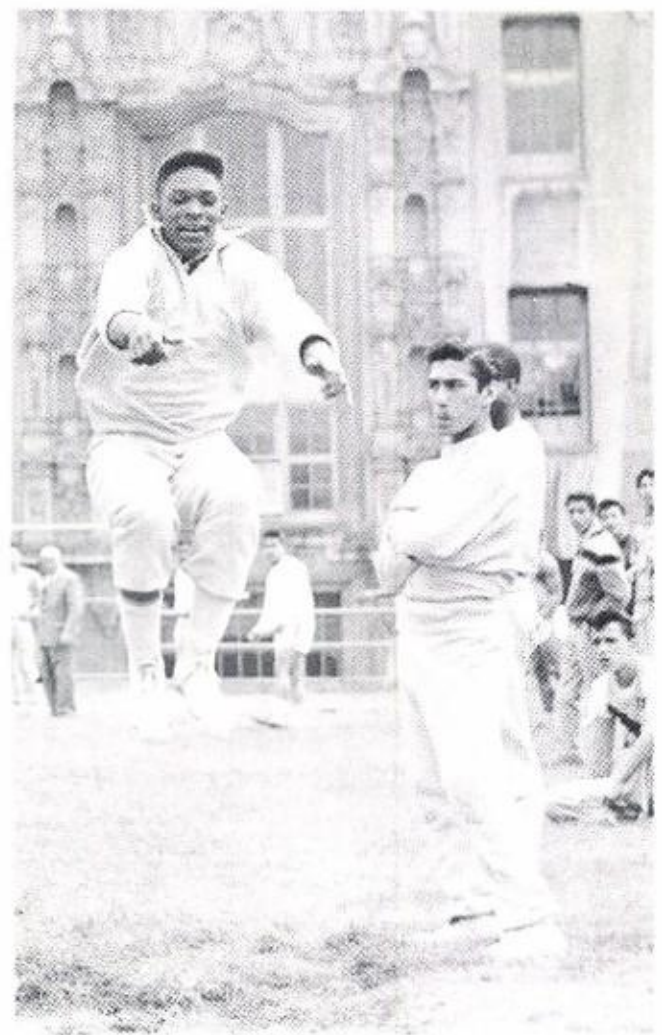

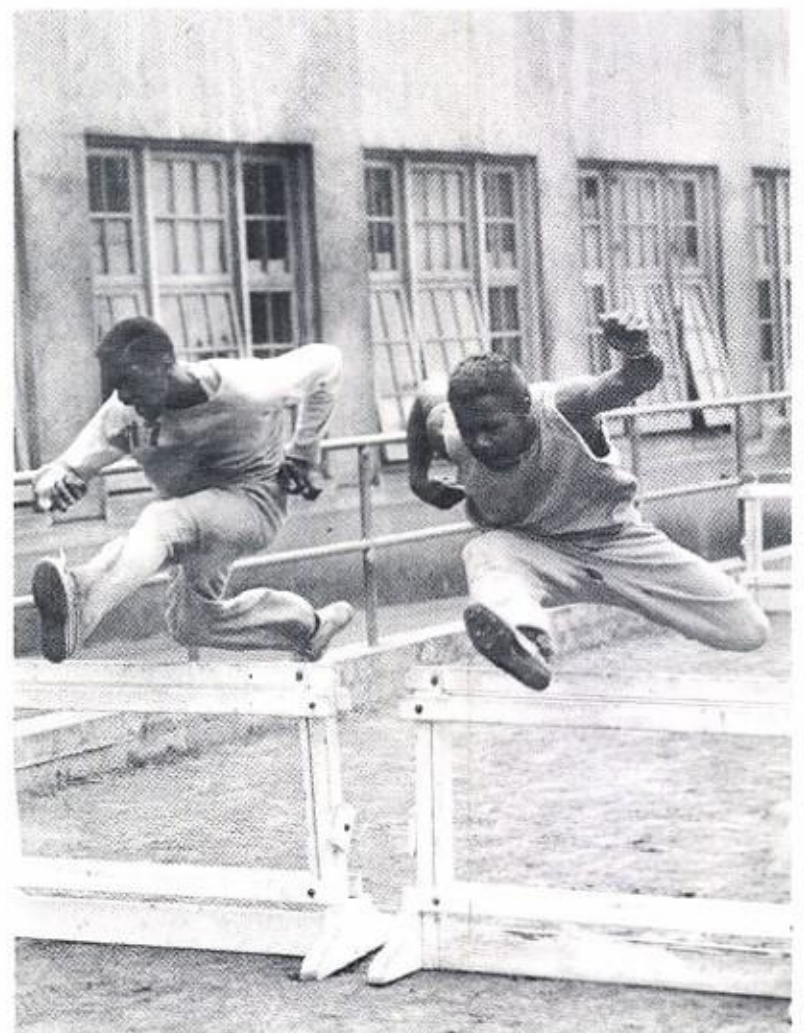
