


The 1957 PORCUPINE, patterned after a newspaper, illustrates an eventful year at Reedley High School.

From bold headlines to humorous anecdotes the students have established themselves as front-page material. The faculty, ever behind the news, has been the motivating force in achieving their goals.


The sports green mirrors the results of smooth co-ordination coupled with an unquenchable thirst for victory.


Juniors Near Goal

B's Win Top Honors For . . .










Divisional Champs




Student Council Leads






Entre Nous Adorns

In February this chapter hosted the Fresno County Hi-Y Conference held in Reedley.






