


# The campus community, dormant for the summer, moves into action . . .


# "We've Got the Bell"



The second half of the program was devoted to holiday music. The band performed these songs for the enjoyment of the listening audience.





# "Winter Wonderland"








## Warrior Editor . . .




## Another Deadline?





## Not all learning comes from books!







Under the advisory of teachers Bob Jacobs and Jerry Lewis (1), the Mother Earth Club is one of the most active on campus.




The sitting students are members












## Physical Education


were recognized in a separate ceremony this year. For the first time in South City's history, the mid-year graduates were specially honored. Ceremonies took place in the auditorium, January 24.





The theme for this year's IRIS is DIRECTIONS because, as we stated earlier, our campus population comes from a variety of locations.




The end of the school year is here. The underclassmen, and classwomen, can look forward to a free summer and planning for next year. A new IRIS staff will look forward to documenting their achievements.


