Varsity Football





Frosh Football





Varsity Cross Country












This year's Varsity Basketball Team must be considered as one of the greatest teams in this proud history of S.E. Sports. Under the superb coaching of Bob Drucker, in his eighteenth season as Head Coach, the Cats breezed to a 10-2 preseason and were expected to win the league title. What they did was beyond all expectation: they steamrolled their first eleven league opponents by such scores as 90-62, 78-49, and 52-37. 






