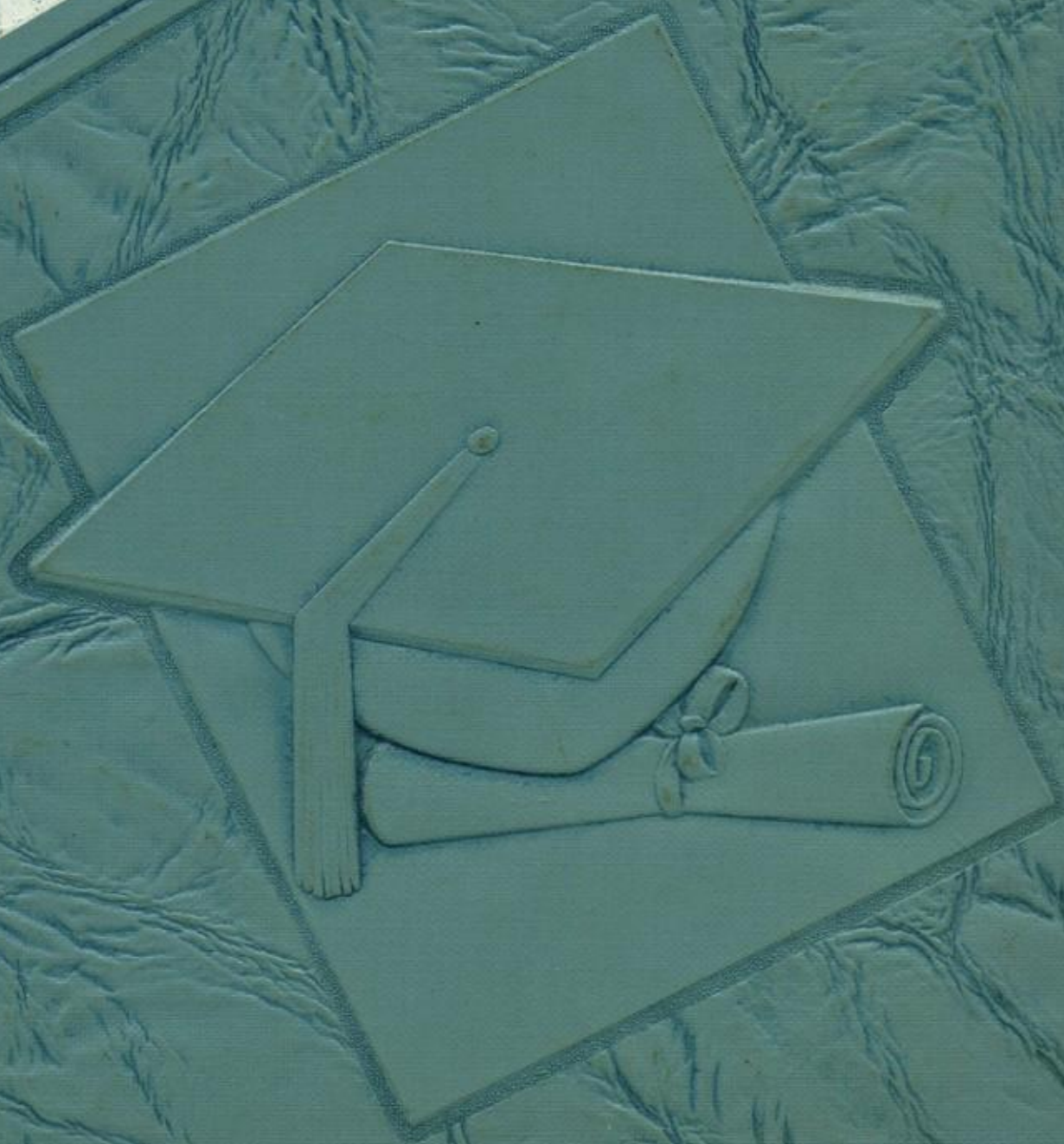

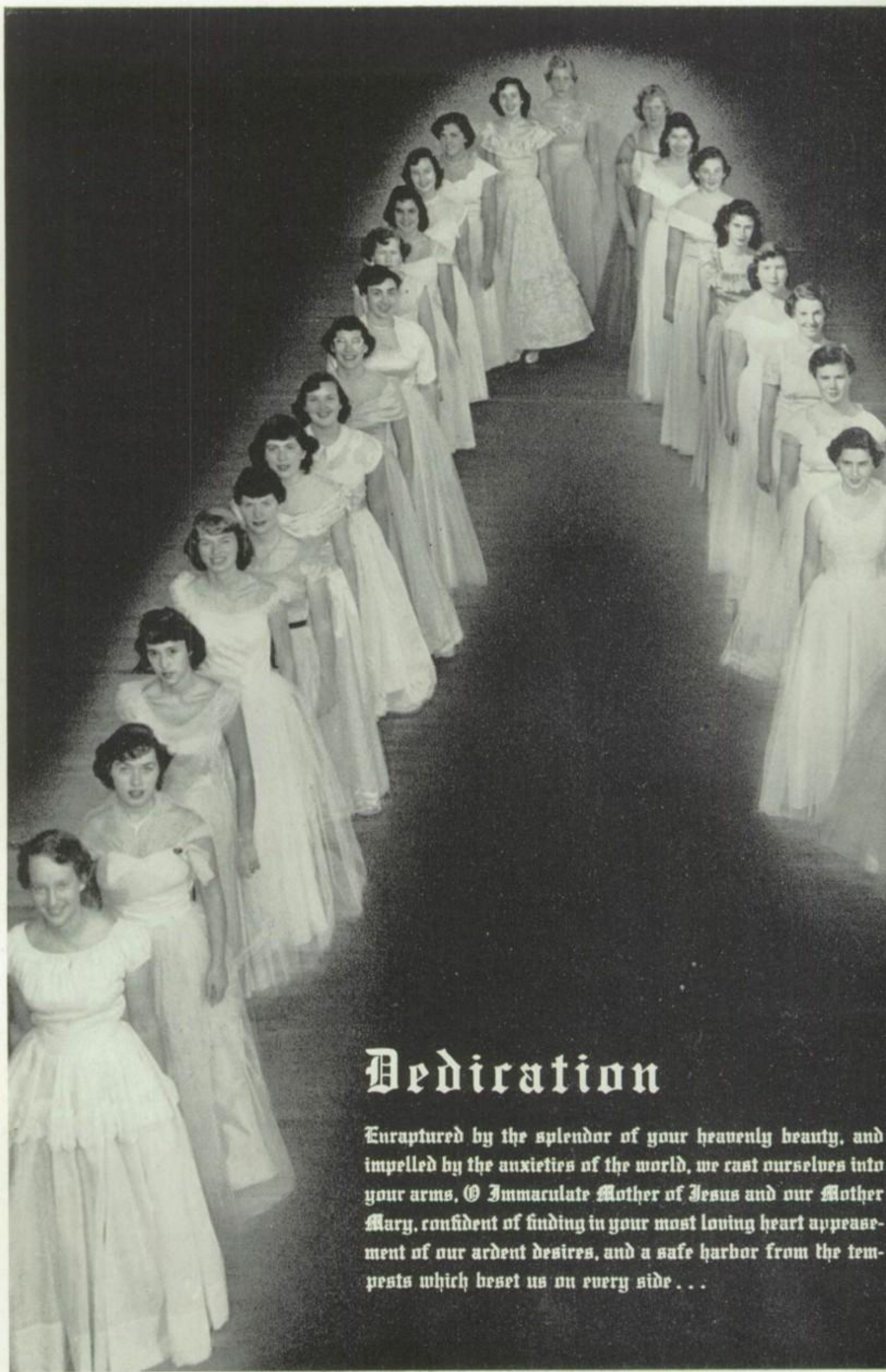

We pray that this stalwart courier of God will receive bountifully the reward of blessings that he merits each day, and may they be a constant source of joy to him.



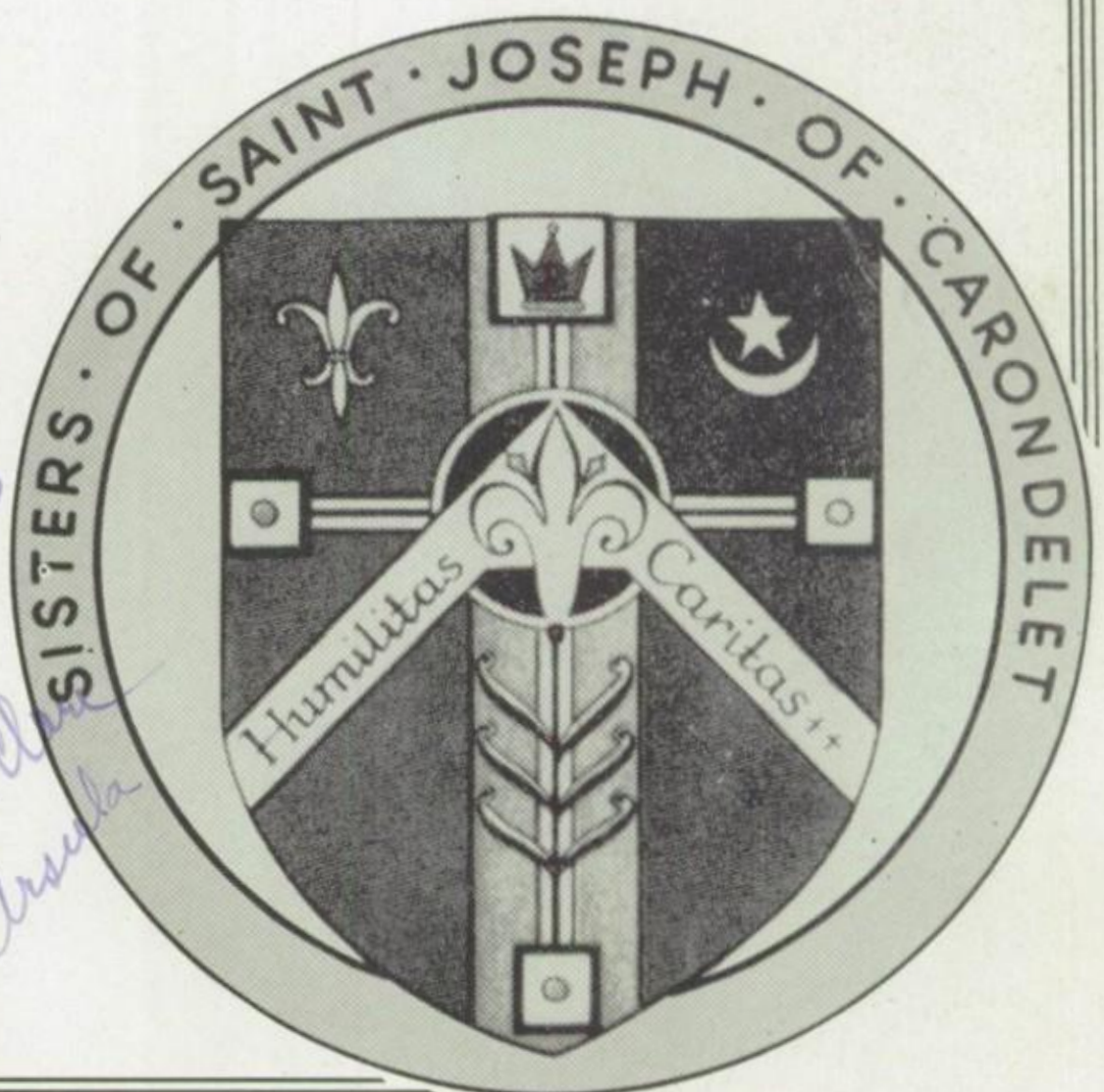
