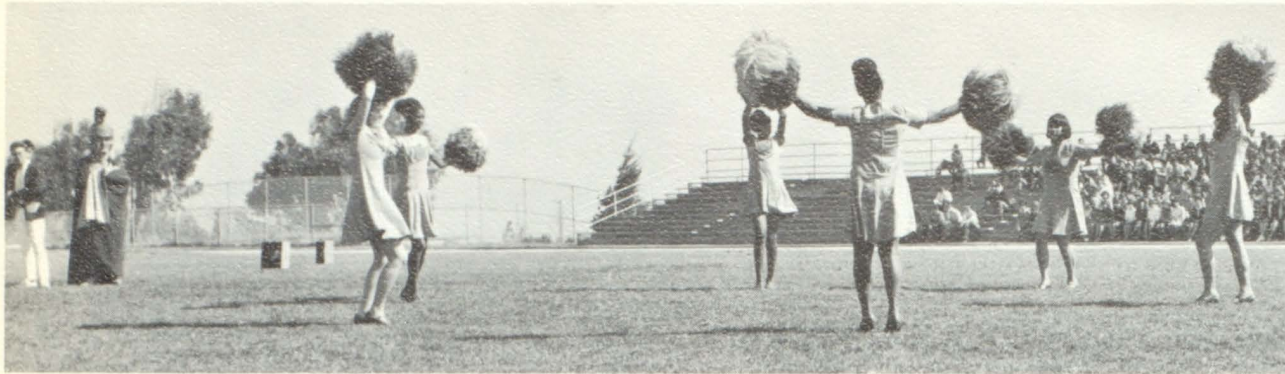

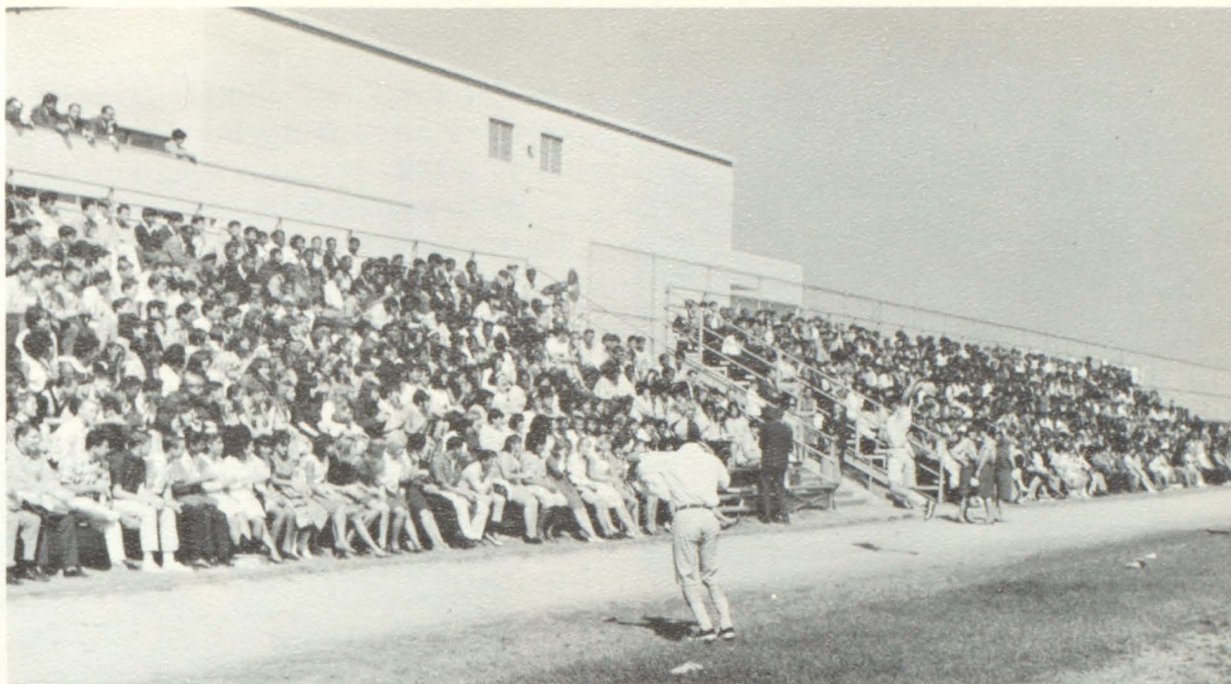

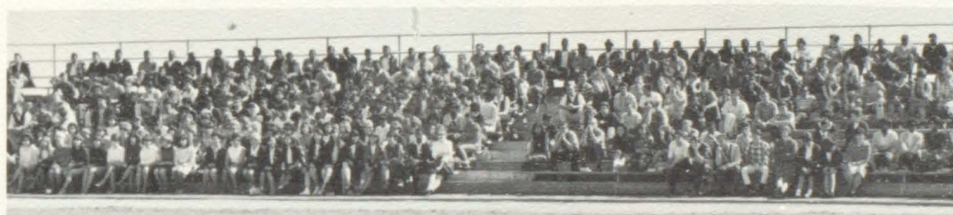

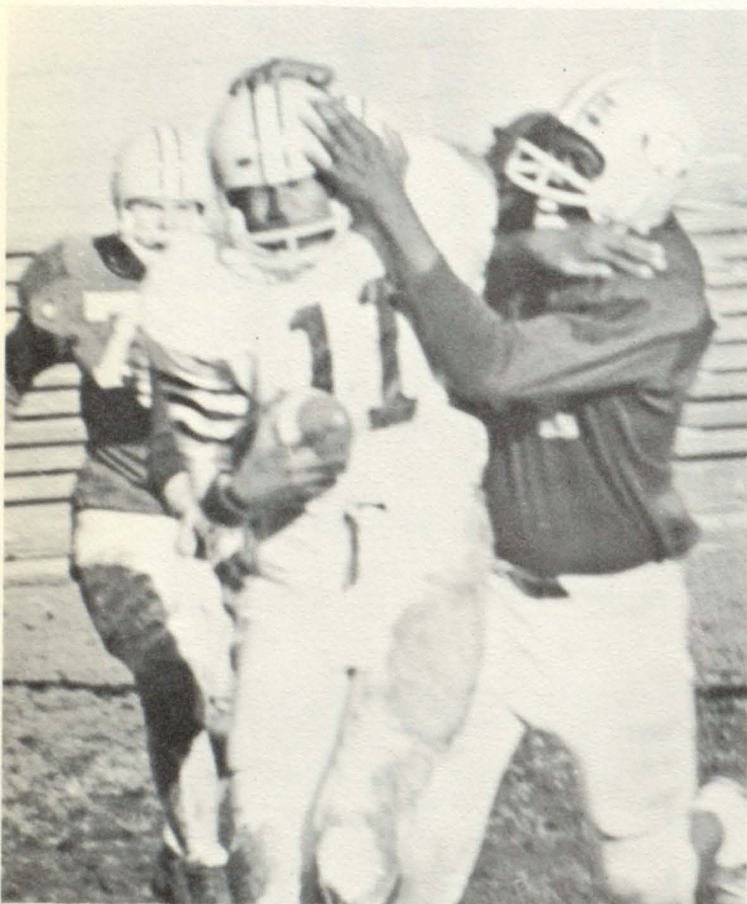

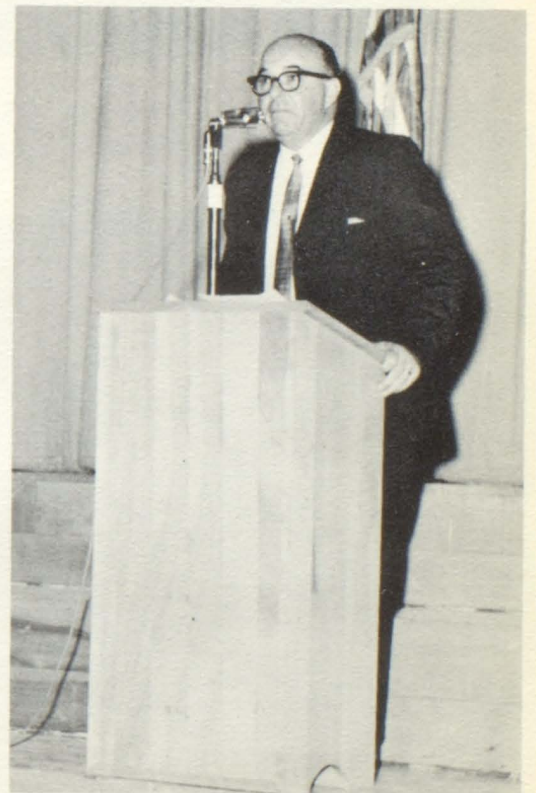

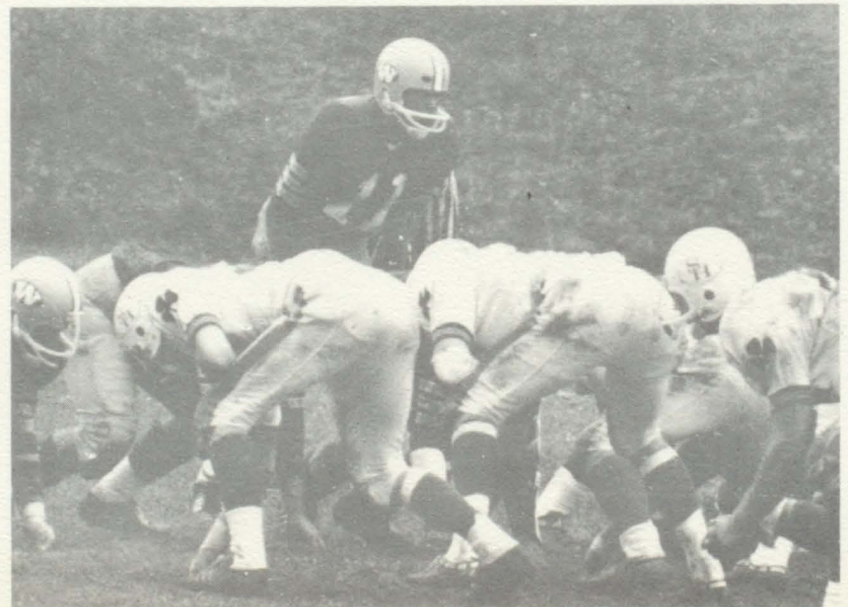

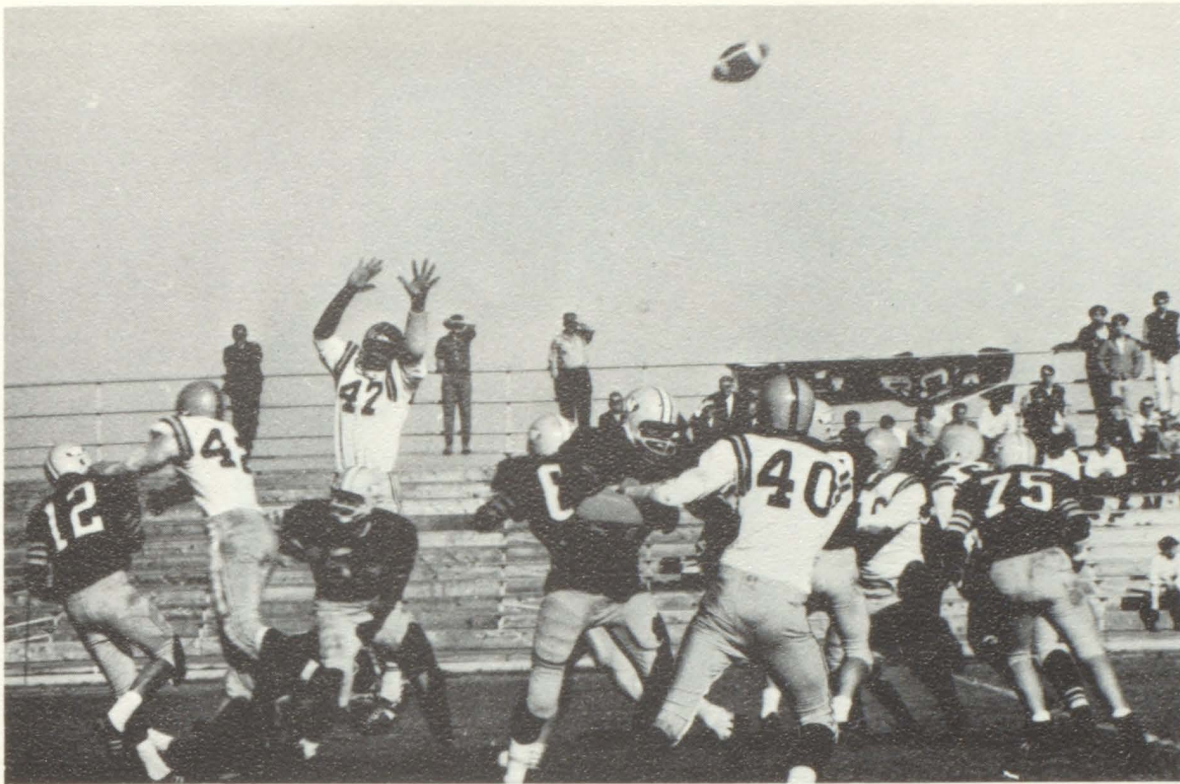

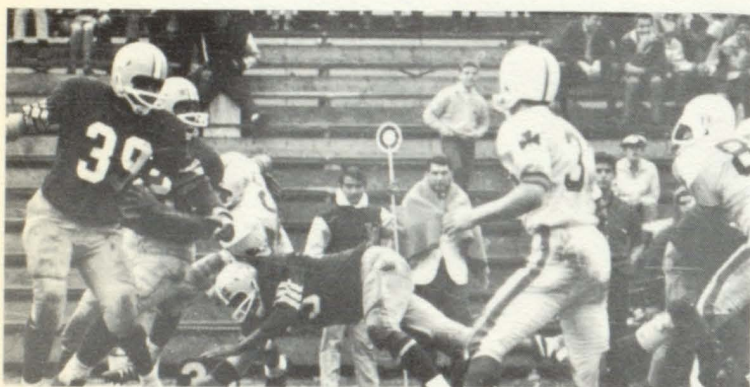

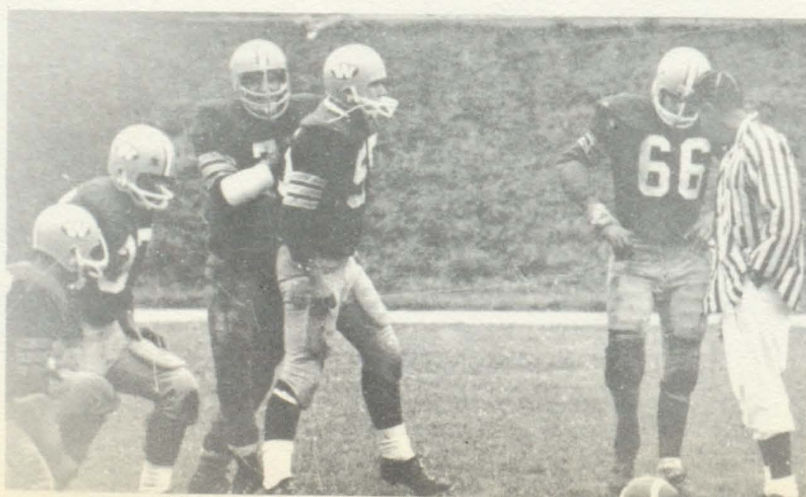

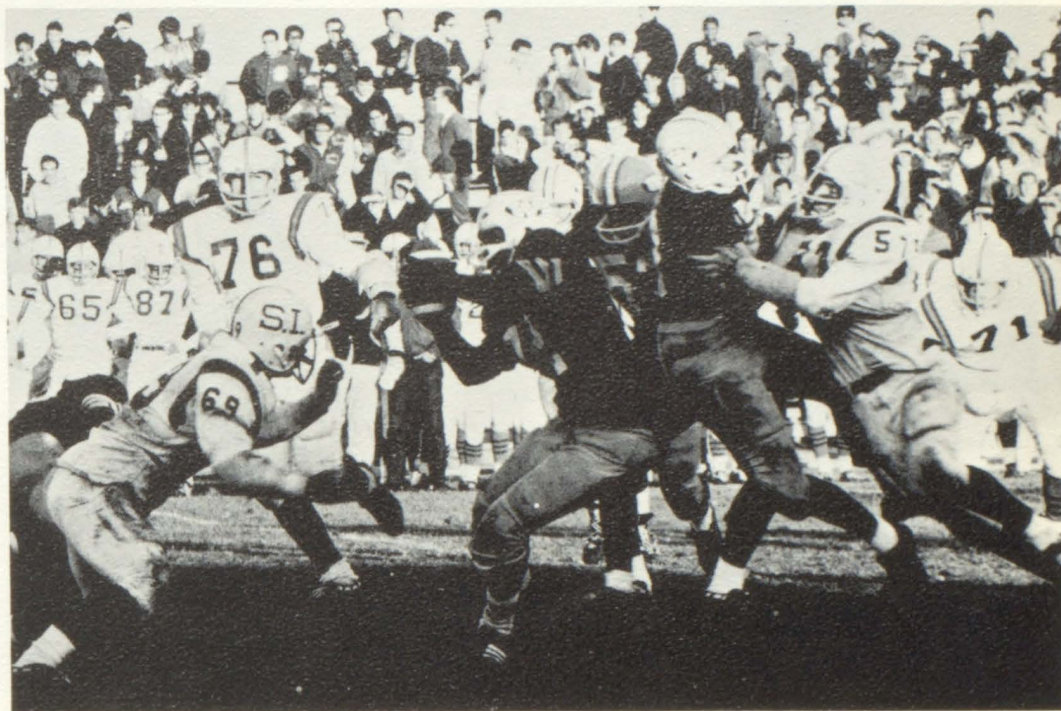

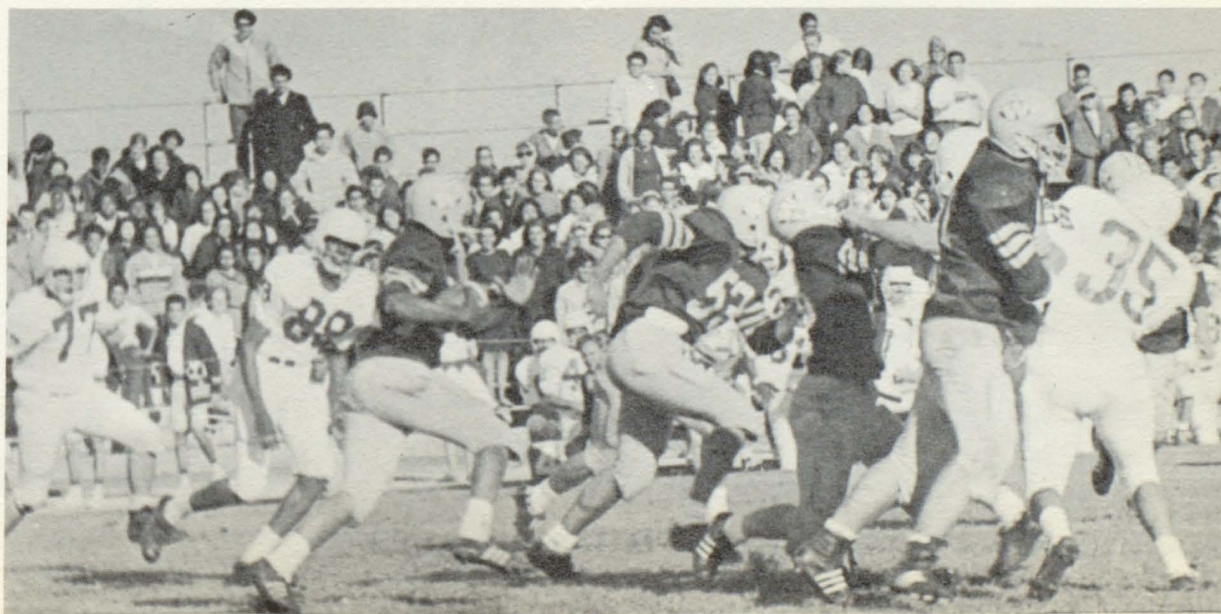

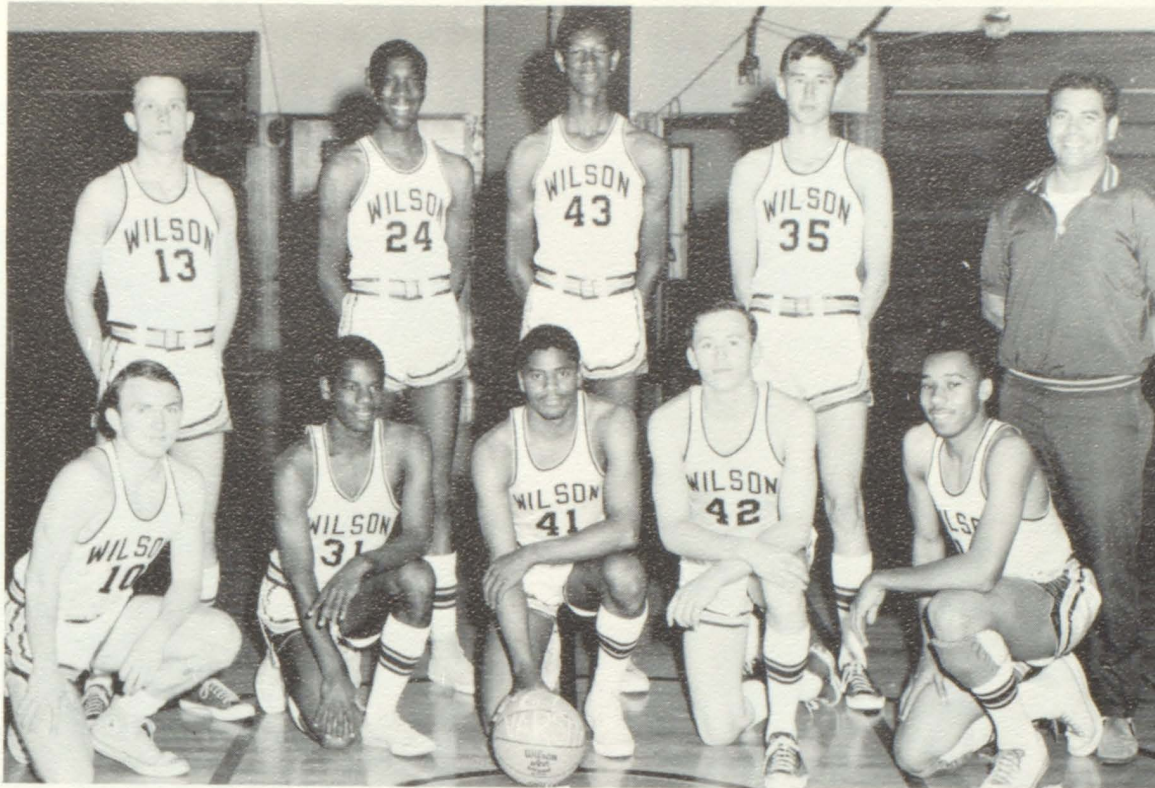

dribbling and foul shooting. Charles Bolds, Mike Mims, and James Seaman did a "bang-up" job all year.

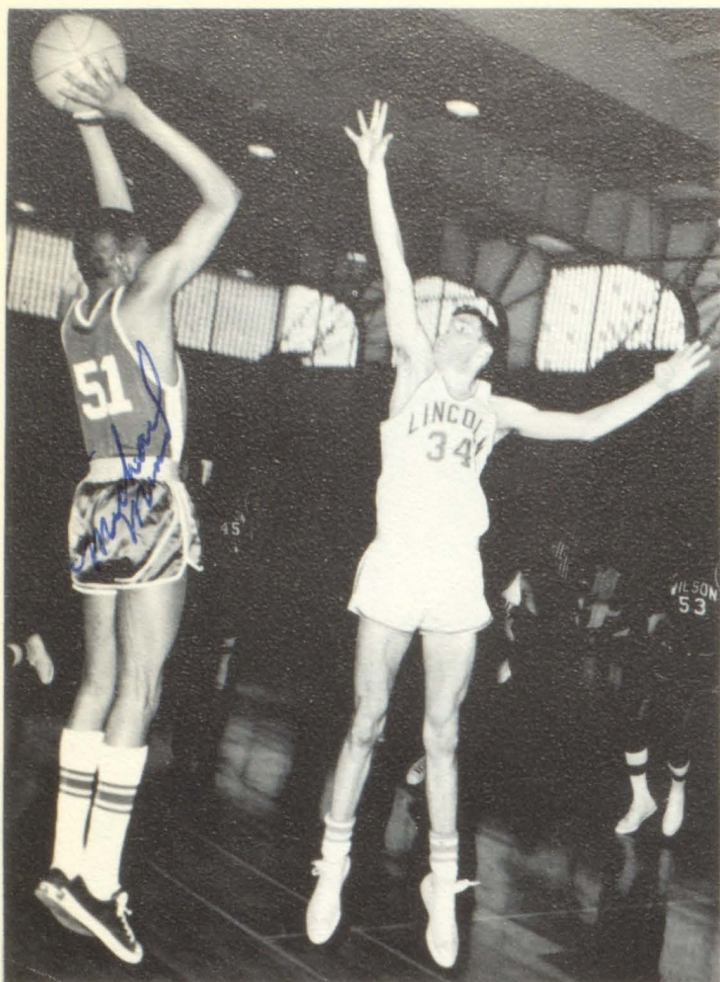

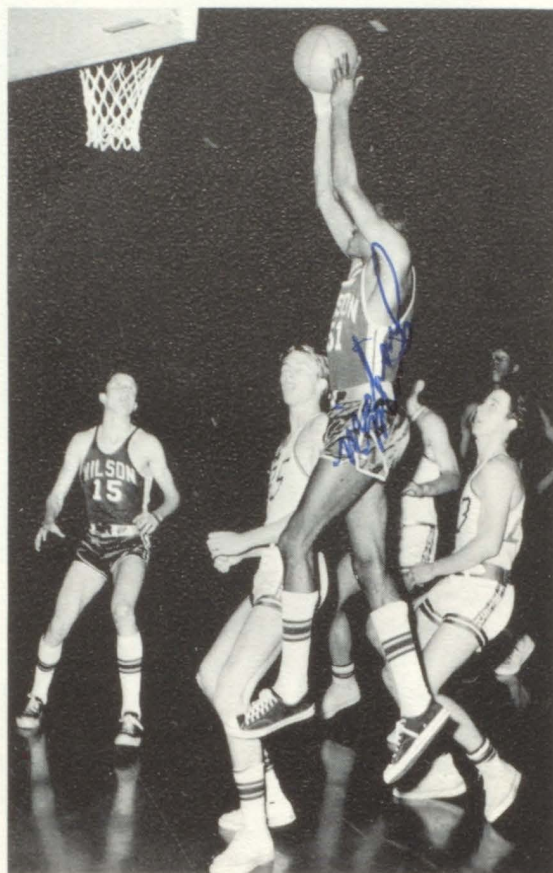

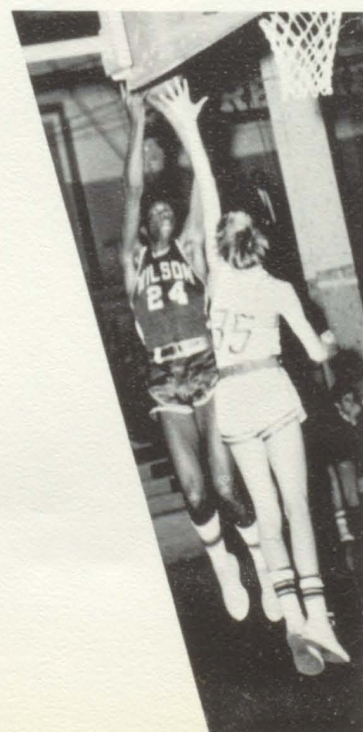

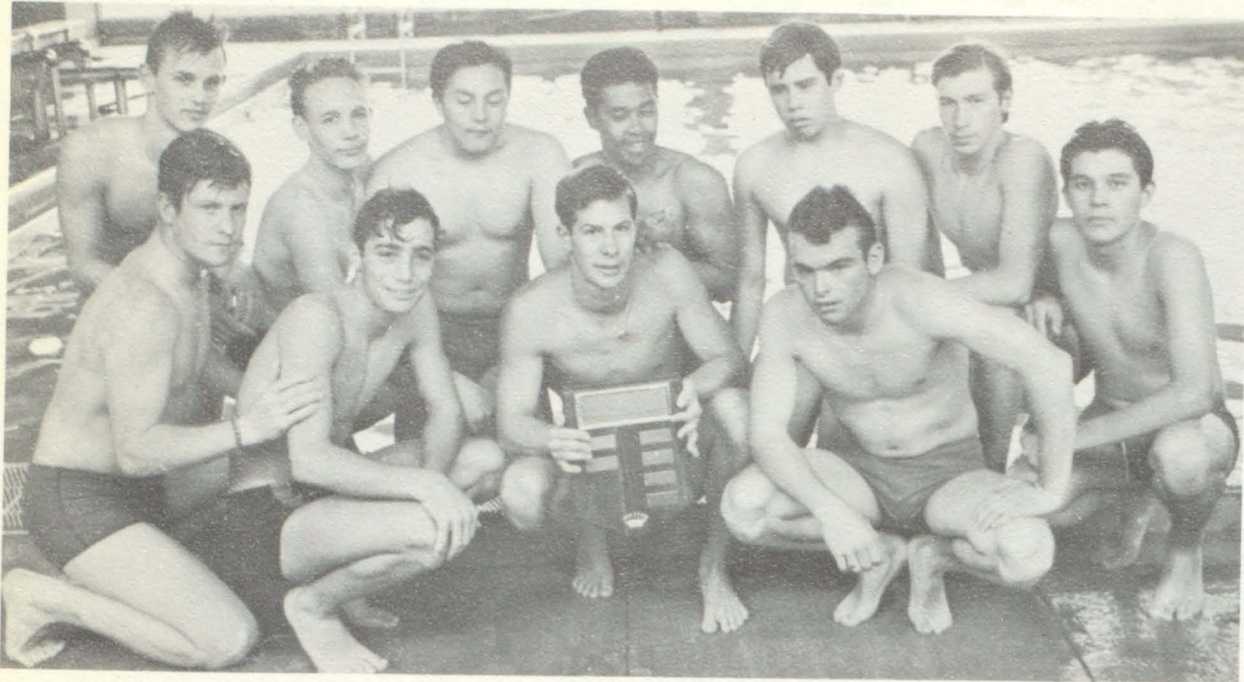

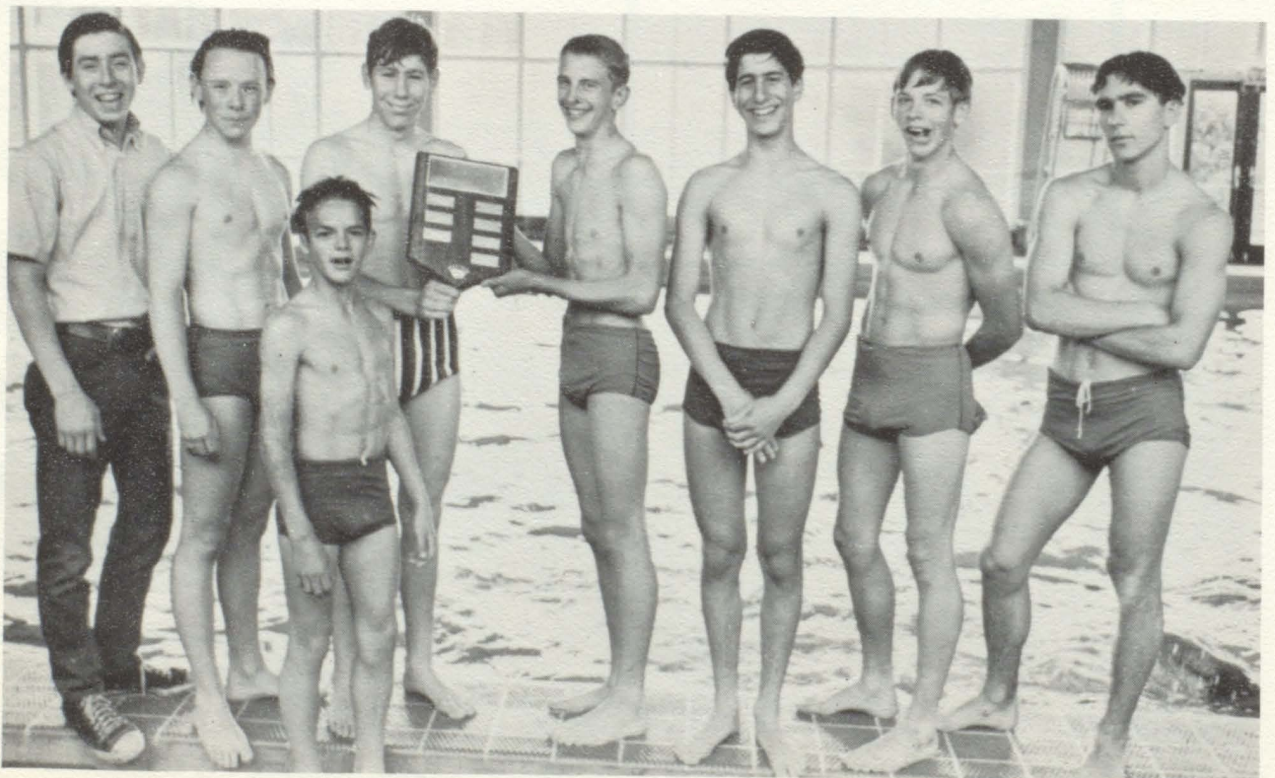

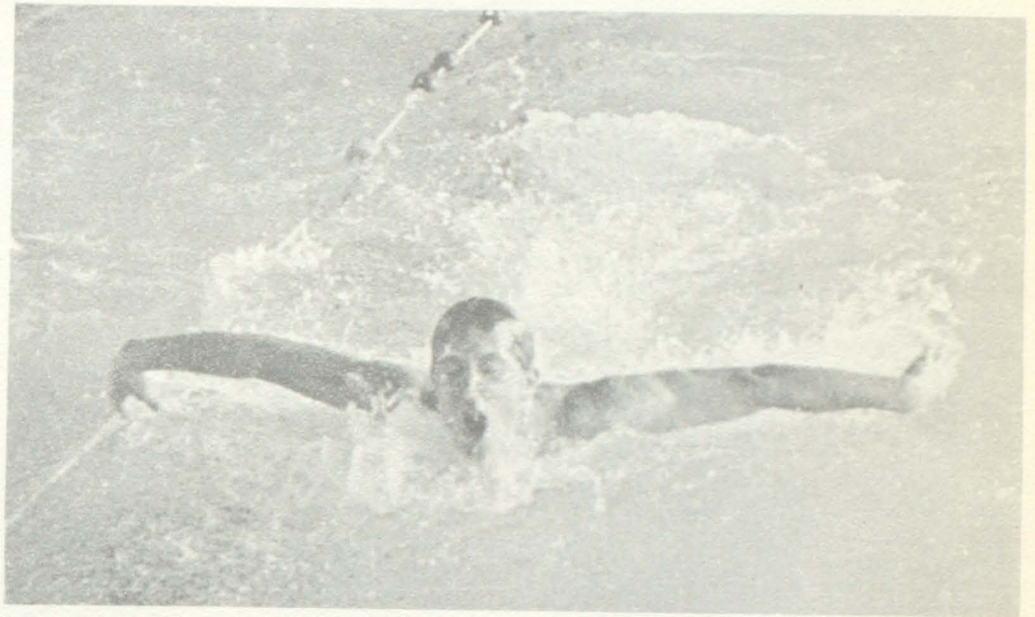

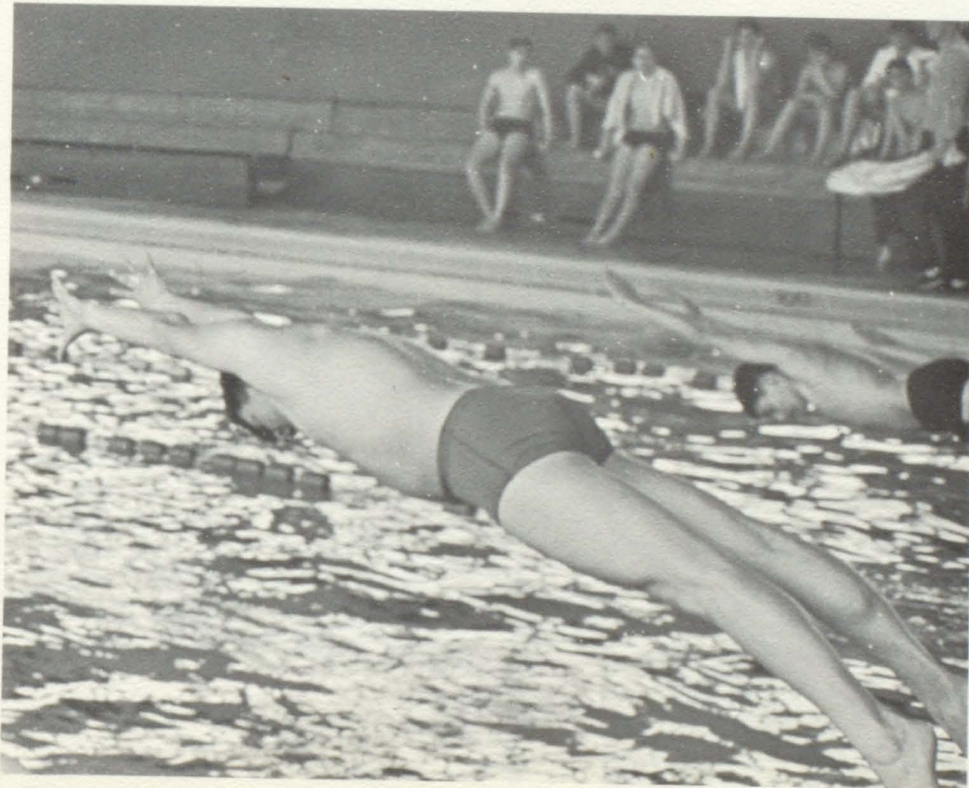
School Records

Bob Bradley, and Frank Martinez were expected to shoulder the heavy load in 1967. After three games, Wilsonites had cause to believe this would be another championship year.

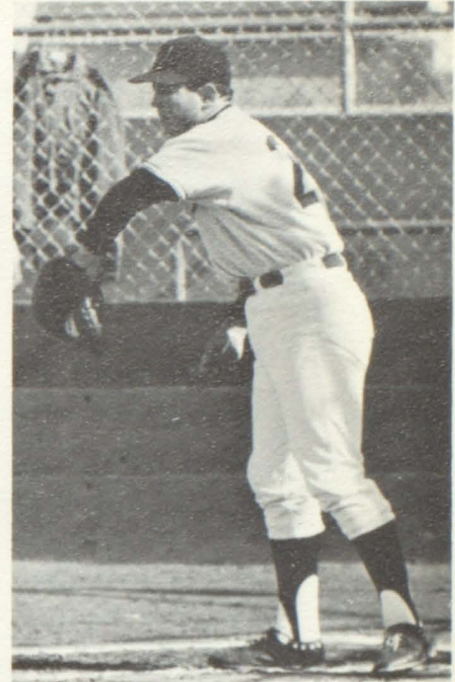

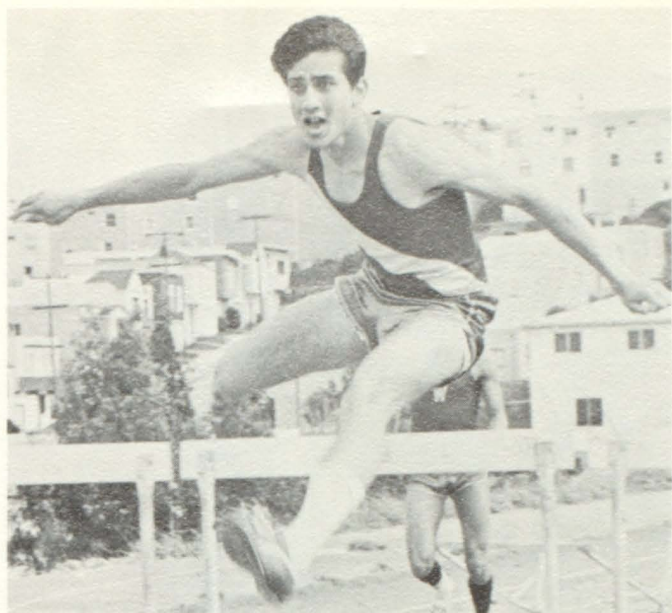

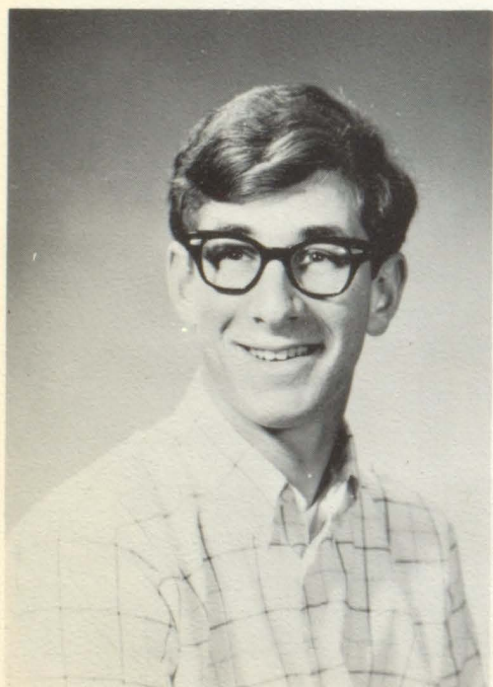
